MNH services offered

Photocopying & Printing

Photocopying documents is provided for a small charge:

- A4-size colour originals are 40 cents per copy (10 cents for monochrome)
- A3-size colour originals is \$1.00 per copy (20 cents for monochrome)

Electronic copies of photographs or documents in most popular formats—PDF, MS-Office—can be printed for a small charge:

- A4-size colour printing is 40 cents per page (10 cents for monochrome)
- A3-size colour printing is \$1.00 per page (20 cents for monochrome)

Laminating

Documents can be protected by having them laminated. The fee per sheet is:

- \$1.50 for A4-size, or
- \$2.50 for A3-size

Binding

We now have a comb binding machine to give your A4-size documents that professional touch. Binding up to 80 pages costs \$2.00. Plastic cover sheets are 50 cents each.

Community Garden

Our community garden plots have had a year or two to get established now and we've had several successful crops. We've added some fruit trees: apricots & plums, lemons & limes. If you'd like to grow your own produce, but don't have the room, plots are available for rent at \$10/year plus \$10 deposit for a garden key. At the main entrance to MNH, there is sensory/herb garden with interesting textures and aromas.

Short-term Computer Use

Nowadays, there is a common expectation that everyone has computer technology and internet access around the clock, but the reality is sometimes different, especially in country areas. While we don't exactly offer 24-hour help in these areas, during open hours MNH has computers available for short-term use. The internet-connected computers are of the Windows variety with software to suit the majority of uses. If you need temporary use of a computer or just internet

access, please come and see us at the neighbourhood house.

Library

At any time during MNH open hours (see front page), books may be borrowed from the 1,000+ titles in our library. There is no charge for library borrowing.

Op-Shop

Our Op-Shop (The Old Fire Shed Op-Shop or just TOFS) reopened on 28th February. TOFS, at 16 Cathcart Street, is excellent value—most items are just two dollars! Detailed opening times are on page 1.

Venue Hire

The Marong Neighbourhood House is available to hire for functions, meetings, parties, etc. at the following rates:

- Functions/meetings: \$10.00
- Group Bookings (half day): \$30.00
- Birthday Parties: \$30.00 for regular members, and \$50.00 for non-members

There is a limit of 50 people inside the building. Hiring the venue is subject to availability. If required, Public Liability insurance is available **on application** at no additional charge.

Free CoGB Wi-Fi

The City of Greater Bendigo provides free Wi-Fi internet access at the Neighbourhood House—no password required. Please note that this service is NOT secure, and is therefore unsuited to sensitive activities such as internet banking.

MNH Wi-Fi

In addition to the free CoGB Wi-Fi, MNH offers password-protected Wi-Fi internet. Please ask for the password. Fees for access to MNH Wi-Fi are at present waived.

Recycling

MNH is a recycling drop-off point for the CoGB ewaste programme, soft plastics, blister packs, and we participate in the Mobile Muster programme for old phones. Page 6 has more details.


Recipe of the Month

Healthy Spicy Pumpkin Soup Recipe

The secret to this perfect autumn soup is adding an apple for sweetness.











Ingredients

- 1 tsp canola oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 tsp ground cumin
- 2 tsp curry powder
- 3 cups pumpkin, peeled and chopped into 2cm cubes
- 1 small sweet potato, peeled and chopped into 2cm cubes
- 2 medium potatoes, peeled and chopped into 2cm cubes
- 1 apple, peeled, cored and quartered
- 1 tsp reduced-salt vegetable stock
- 1 L water
- 4 Tbs low-fat natural or Greek yoghurt, to serve
- 4 slices wholemeal or multigrain bread, to serve

Variation: Roast the vegies in the oven first for a sweeter, more intense flavour

Note: If freezing, use less water to make a thick soup. Restore consistency by adding water when thawed.

Method

- Heat oil in a large pot and fry onion, garlic, cumin and curry powder for 2 minutes.
- 2. Add the rest of the ingredients and simmer for 10 minutes or until the vegetables are just soft.
- 3. Use a stick blender, normal blender or food processor to blitz the soup till smooth. Add more water if you prefer a runnier soup.
- 4. Serve with a slice of toast and a spoonful of yoghurt.

Recycling options

E-waste recycling

The City of Greater Bendigo has provided Marong Neighbourhood House with one of their small e-waste stations. Drop your e-waste items into_____MNH anytime—the e-waste station (bin) is under cover on the side / verandah—and we will make sure they don't end up in landfill. We accept any small- to medium-sized mains- or battery-powered items, as well as:

Small batteries Cables and leads

Printer cartridges Computer keyboards & mice

Optical disk drives Chargers

Double adapters & power boards Multi-adapter plugs

USB memory/SD cards Light bulbs







MNH is once again a drop-off point for soft plastic waste. Three bins for soft plastics are situated beside the pathway at the side of the House.

An arrangement has been struck between the City of Greater Bendigo and the Close the Loop company. The plastics we collect are taken to the Council collection point at Eaglehawk, and from there it is passed to Close the Loop for recycling into road-base additive.

Nobody wants to pick the plastic out of the bin piece-by-piece, so **please** drop it off in see-through bags. Thank you.



MNH also takes all brands of used, over-the-counter medicinal blister packs and Webster packs for recycling. Please ensure your blister packs are completely empty and dry before dropping them off. The programme accepts only the actual blister packs – do not include anything else. The blister packs are sent to Terracycle, then the metal foils are re-smelted and the plastics are melted down for reuse.



If you drop your old mobile in to MNH, we will get it started on it's recycling journey in an official MobileMuster satchel. MobileMuster and their recycling partner companies then recover over 95% of the materials—glass, aluminium, precious & rare metals, plastic—even the paper and cardboard of the packaging are all saved from land-fill.

Safe Use and Maintenance of Chainsaws for Absolute Beginners

Course Description:

An in-depth, in-person course covering the safe use and maintenance of chainsaws for absolute beginners.

Suitable for ages 12+ (adult supervision required for u/18 participants), this course covers where and when to collect firewood for domestic use on public land in Victoria, the parts of a chainsaw and how to maintain them, 2-stroke vs electric chainsaws, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), best practice OHS considerations for using a chainsaw, technique and tips for cross cutting felled logs.

Theory is covered in the morning before an early lunch. We will then travel to the nearest collection area for supervised practical cutting practice. Participants are required to wear closed-toe shoes and lace-up steel caps are preferred. PPE (work gloves, eye/head/hearing protection) will be supplied. Please BYO lunch and mugs/water bottle. If you have a chainsaw with which you would like to become better acquainted, feel free to bring that along too.

The following opinion/editorial was provided by the Federal Member for Bendigo, Lisa Chesters MP.

On Gender-Based and Intimate Partner Violence Member for Bendigo, Lisa Chesters

The Federal Government is committed to taking action to address what can only be described as a national crisis of gender-based, and intimate-partner violence.

This is an issue that many local people have raised with me during my recent round of Listening Posts across the electorate. It is an issue that leaves many of us frightened, angry and frustrated. We are all asking ourselves, 'How can a man murder their intimate partner?' A shocking one quarter of Australian women will experience intimate partner violence in their lifetime.

Keeping Australian women safe requires immediate action.

The Federal Government is taking action on this national crisis of violence against women in several key ways.

We will work with the States and Territories to strengthen accountability and consequences for perpetrators, including early intervention with high-risk perpetrators and serial offenders, and strategies to better facilitate best practice justice responses to support victim-survivors of violence. The Councils for Police Ministers and Attorneys-General will work towards these goals, specifically by improving police responses to the reporting of violence, and information sharing about perpetrators across systems and jurisdictions.

We will deliver the Leaving Violence Program, investing \$925.2 million over five years to help people experiencing intimate partner violence with the costs associated with leaving the relationship. This program will offer \$5,000 in financial assistance, safety assessments and referrals to support pathways for eligible persons fleeing violence, regardless of gender or visa status.

We have also committed to strengthen and build on prevention work through targeted, evidence-based approaches.

But we must do more.

One of the most important measures announced by last week's National Cabinet is the plan to stop the distribution of harmful material that exacerbates violence against women, such as violent online pornography, and misogynistic content targeting children and young people.

The Labor Government will introduce new measures including legislation to ban the creation and publication of non-consensual digitally created and altered, 'deepfake' pornography, provide additional funding for the eSafety Commission to pilot age-assurance technologies to be deployed around access to potentially harmful adult content, and the launch of the 'Stop it at the Start' campaign intended to oppose the influence and prevalence of online content which normalises violence against girls and women.

We must rid our community of violence against girls and women, and do so with urgency.
