This month, it's farewell to Term 3, as the weather starts it's very changeable spring routine. It always gets colder just when you think it's finally getting warmer, doesn't it?

Pancake Breakfast

As usual, our free Pancake Breakfast on the first Monday each month of the school term continues. Drop in for a free feed and gossip with other locals between 8:30 and 9:30am. The breakfasts this term are 4th of August and 1st of September. After that, the next one is our first day back in Term 4 (6 October).

Electricity Rebate Extended

The Commonwealth government's Energy Bill Relief scheme, which was due to end with the financial year, has been extended until the end of 2025. A further two quarterly rebates of \$75 each will automatically be applied to household energy bills. Once again, it's a bit more involved for people on an embedded network (caravan park residents) – but drop in for us to take care of it all for you.

Power Saving Bonus, 5th Round

Separate from the rebate above, the fifth round of the Power Saving Bonus commenced on 25th August. Applicants for this round must hold at least one of the following concession cards: Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession Card, Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card, or Veterans' Affairs Gold Card. The bonus is a single payment of \$100, to be paid by cheque or directly into your bank account (EFT).

Applications can be made online at https://compare.energy.vic.gov.au/psb-faq, or we at the Neighbourhood House can assist you. To apply, you will need a copy of your latest electricity bill, your concession card, your driver's licence or medicare card, and your bank details if you prefer payment by EFT.

Spotlight on: TOFS Op-Shop

The Old Fire Shed (we call it TOFS) Op-Shop, at 16 Cartcart Street, is Marong's own social enterprise Op-Shop, managed by Marong Neighbourhood House, run by and for volunteers. Goods are made available for sale thanks to generous community donations, and the staff volunteer their time.

TOFS Op-Shop gives you the opportunity to find donated goods, vintage pre-loved fashion, homewares, or charming pieces of bric-a-brac. Visiting TOFS is like dusting off an old treasure chest — perhaps you'll find rare period garments and unusual accessories; quirky or chic secondhand items; even some brand-new, neverused goods.

Op-Shops can provide an interesting pastime if you aren't looking for something specific – and being closeby, if you do have something particular in mind, it takes only a moment to drop in often to check for new stock.

Clothes from the Op-Shop are cheap to begin with – most items at TOFS are only \$3 – and are more likely to be made of natural fibres instead of synthetic plastics, so you get more wear from them – saving you further money in the long run.

Any money raised from Op-Shop sales is used by MNH to benefit the community, eg. funds are used to subsidise programs such as First Aid courses.

If you would like to donate to TOFS Op-Shop, please only do so while the shop is attended, and please donate only items you would be prepared to buy – no damaged or dirty clothing, no broken or dirty goods. Unfortunately, TOFS Op-Shop cannot accept undergarments, furniture, electronic items, or mattresses.

The shop is open 9:30am-12:30pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and 10:00am-12:00pm on Saturdays. The shop does not open during school holidays.

Photocopying & Printing

For a small charge per page, document photocopying, printing of digital photographs, or printing documents in most popular formats (PDF, MS-Office) can be done:

Laminating

Documents can be protected by having them laminated. The fee per sheet is:

- \$1.50 for A4-size, or
- \$2.50 for A3-size

Binding

We now have a comb binding machine to give your A4-size documents that professional touch. Binding up to 80 pages costs \$2.00. Plastic cover sheets are 50 cents each.

Community Garden

Our community garden plots have had a year or two to get established now and we've had several successful crops. We now have a couple of worm farms, as well as some fruit trees: apricots & plums, lemons & limes. If you'd like to grow your own produce, but don't have the room, plots are available for rent at \$10/year plus \$10 deposit for a garden key. At the main entrance to MNH, there is sensory/herb garden with interesting textures and aromas.

Short-term Computer Use

Nowadays, there is a common expectation that everyone has computer technology and internet access around the clock, but the reality is sometimes different, especially in country areas. While we don't exactly offer 24-hour help in these areas, during open hours MNH has computers available for short-term use. The internet-connected computers are of the Windows variety with software to suit the majority of uses. If you need temporary use of a computer or just internet access, please come and see us at the neighbourhood house.

Library

At any time during MNH open hours (see front page), books may be borrowed from the 1,000+ titles in our library. There is no charge for library borrowing.

TOFS Op-Shop

Our Op-Shop (The Old Fire Shed Op-Shop or just

TOFS), at 16 Cathcart Street, is excellent value—most items are just three dollars! Detailed opening times are on page 1.

Venue Hire

The Marong Neighbourhood House is available to hire for functions, meetings, parties, etc. at the following rates:

- Functions/meetings: \$10.00
- Group Bookings (half day): \$30.00
- Birthday Parties: \$30.00 for regular members, and \$50.00 for non-members

There is a limit of 50 people inside the building. Hiring the venue is subject to availability. If required, Public Liability insurance is available **on application** at no additional charge.

Free CoGB Wi-Fi

The City of Greater Bendigo provides free Wi-Fi internet access at the Neighbourhood House—no password required. Please note that this service is NOT secure, and is therefore unsuited to sensitive activities such as internet banking.

MNH Wi-Fi

In addition to the free CoGB Wi-Fi, MNH offers password-protected Wi-Fi internet. Please ask for the password. Fees for access to MNH Wi-Fi are at present waived.

Recycling

MNH is a recycling drop-off point for the CoGB e-waste programme, soft plastics, blister packs, and we participate in the Mobile Muster programme for old phones. More details are on the following page.



Recycling Options



CLQSE ELOOP MNH is a drop-off point for soft plastic waste. Three bins for soft plastics are situated beside the pathway at the side of the House.

An arrangement has been struck between the City of Greater Bendigo and the Close the Loop company. The plastics we collect are taken to the Council collection point at Eaglehawk, and from there it is passed to Close the Loop for recycling into pallets, crates, trolleys, and road-base additive.

Nobody wants to pick the plastic out of the bin piece-by-piece, so **please** drop it off in see-through bags. Thank you.

If you drop your old mobile in to MNH, we will get it started on it's recycling journey in an official MobileMuster satchel. MobileMuster and their recycling partner companies then recover over 95% of the materials—glass, aluminium, precious & rare metals, plastic—even the paper and cardboard of the packaging are all saved from land-fill.





The Pharmacy that supports your Community!





Thanks to EUFS sponsorship, MNH also takes all brands of used, over-the-counter medicinal blister packs and Webster packs for recycling. Please ensure your blister packs are completely empty and dry before dropping them off. The programme accepts only the actual blister packs — do not include anything else. The blister packs are sent to Pharmacycle, then the metal foils are re-smelted and the plastics are melted down for reuse.

E-waste recycling

The City of Greater Bendigo has provided Marong Neighbourhood House with one of their small e-waste stations. Drop your e-waste items into MNH anytime—the e-waste station (bin) is under cover on the side / verandah—and we will make sure they don't end up in landfill. We accept any small- to medium-sized mains- or battery-powered items, as well as:

Small <u>taped-up</u> batteries Cables and leads

Printer cartridges Computer keyboards & mice

Optical disk drives Chargers

Double adapters & power boards Multi-adapter plugs



Recipe of the Month

Healthy Chocolate Zucchini Muffins

Perfect for the lunchbox, these muffins sneak in some hidden veg!











Ingredients

spray olive or canola oil spray

80g brown sugar

40g cocoa powder

½ tsp baking powder

½ tsp Baking soda (bicarbonate)

1 cup plain flour

1 cup wholemeal plain flour

3 eggs

200ml reduced-fat plain yoghurt

2 tsp vanilla extract

3 tbs canola oil

300g zucchini, grated

½ cup sultanas

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan forced). Spray muffin tins with oil.
- 2. Place sugar in a large bowl and break up any lumps. Sift in cocoa, baking powder, bicarb and flours, returning husks from the sieve to the bowl.
- 3. Lightly beat eggs in a cup with a fork then add to flour mix with yoghurt, vanilla and oil. Stir to combine (mix will still be quite dry), then mix in zucchini and sultanas.
- 4. Spoon mixture into prepared muffin tins (makes 18) and bake for 20 minutes or until a skewer poked into the centre of a muffin comes out clean. Cool in tin for 5 minutes then turn onto a wire rack to cool completely.

Variation:

Try other dried fruit like cranberries or raisins, or add 2 Tbs chopped nuts or seeds

Serving Suggestion:

To help picky eaters, little green flecks in the muffins can be avoided by peeling the zucchini.






Tape Your Terminals

If battery terminals touch, they can spark and catch fire. To prevent this, tape the terminals of used batteries. Always use <u>clear</u> sticky tape.

Different batteries have terminals in different places. Regular batteries, like AA, have terminals at both ends, while others, like 9-volt batteries, have two terminals at the same end. Button battery terminals are on the base and should be covered in clear tape on all sides.
