

2022 Clearwater Firsts & Election Dynamics

- 2 African Americans in the same election cycle (at one point 3)
- Dem Black Caucus and Hispanic Caucus endorsements
- Increased coverage (candidate profiles) in newspaper and TV
- NAACP and Hispanic and other candidate forums
- Multiple GOTV texts from Pinellas Dems
- Outside PAC door knocking and lit drop for a Dem candidate
- Very contentious Seat 5 race largely based on Scientology



UNFAIR DISTRICTS



FLORIDA REDISTRICTING 101

Every 10 years following the U.S. Census, each state's number of Congress people in the U.S. House of Representatives is recalculated based on the current population.

Florida's population grew by 2.9 million residents, giving the state one additional member of Congress (from 27 to 28).

The Florida Legislature redraws the state's U.S. Congressional districts to reflect its new number of Representatives. It also redraws its State House and State Senate districts to account for population changes throughout the state.

FLORIDIANS WANT FAIR DISTRICTS


In 2010, 63% of Florida voters approved two amendments written by the League of Woman Voters and the "Fair Districts Coalition" to help ensure fair redistricting.

The Fair Districts provisions require that district lines:

- not be drawn to favor one political party over another.
- not be drawn to harm voting power of racial or language minorities.
- · are contiguous.

In addition, if possible, the districts should:

- be compact.
- take into account lines of counties and cities.
- take into account geographical boundaries.



2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

During the regular session, a majority of the Legislature publicly indicated interest in adhering to Fair Districts.

The majority passed two maps at the end of the regular session, to avoid Govenor's DeSantis' veto and have a back-up plan in case his preferred map was struck down by the Florida Supreme Court.

SPECIAL SESSION: A COMPLETE 180


After Governor DeSantis vetoed the Legislature's plan, lawmakers returned to Tallahassee for a Special Session to pass the Governor's preferred map.

The enacted map shows blatant partisan intent and disregard for minority voting power by:

- Creating a 20-8 Republican congressional seat advantage in a state where Joe Biden received 48% of the vote.
- Splitting CD5, a protected minority access district in North Florida.
- Forcing St. Petersburg and Tampa into the same district, a configuration the Florida Supreme Court has already ruled unconstitutional.



Flip-flopping on Fair Districts



PINELLAS COUNTY'S DISTRICTS

Two non-competitive districts, spliting St. Petersburg in two along 34th Street.

St. Pete voters east of 34th Street are now in the heavily Democratic FL-14, a Tampa-based district represented by Congresswoman Kathy Castor.

Voters west of 34th Street are in FL-13 with the rest of Pinellas County. Former President Trump won this configuration of the district by 7 points.

St. Petersburg voters make up just 13% of the 13th District and 25% of the 14th District.

This map dilutes Pinellas Democrats' and St. Petersburg's voice and adds to the growing partisan divide in Congress.



WHAT'S HAPPENING NOW?

Many voting rights organizations are mounting legal challenges to this unconstitutional map.

A circuit court judge recently placed a temporary injunction on the configuration of North Florida's CD 5, a minority performing district.

The appeals process is far from over, and legal battles concerning other parts of the map are imminent.

HOW CAN I HELP?

Redistricting happens just once every decade, but we can't wait ten years to fight for fair districts.
