



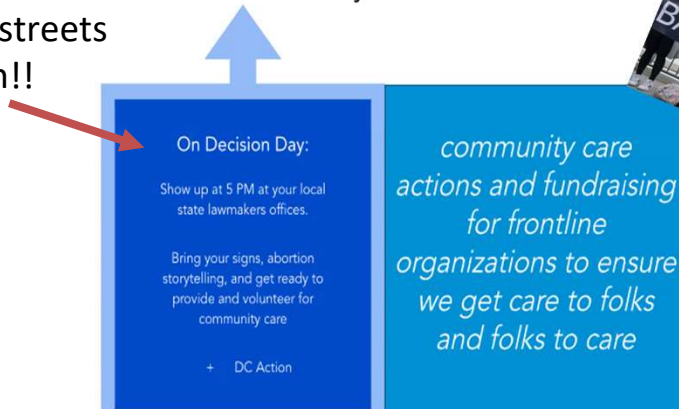

## Talking About Medication Abortion

### Medication Abortion:

- is legal in the United States
- has been proven safe and effective (after 20 years of use in the U.S.)
- is an FDA-approved method to end a pregnancy

## Talking About Medication Abortion

### Medication Abortion is over-regulated in Florida

- requires an appointment with doctor/clinic
  - ultrasound
  - “informed consent” material
  - 24-hour waiting period
  - has contract to stock and dispense mifepristone (first pill)
- drives up cost; reduces access
