

# The Current Global Revival


#### Introduction to Video

#### "The Final Shift Is Here"

My beloved brothers and sisters, I invite you to listen not with your ears alone but with your spirit because something is shifting. Something is stirring in the unseen realm. The atmosphere of the world is changing. And if you're spiritually awake, you can feel it. It's subtle yet urgent, quiet yet thunderous to the soul that walks close with God.

We are not just living in uncertain times. We are standing at the edge of eternity. Before the antichrist reveals himself, before the final tribulation unfolds, there must be a spiritual shaking. A divine shift that separates light from darkness, truth from deception, and the faithful from the faithless. This shift is already underway. God is drawing a line. And the question we must all answer is this. Where will you stand when the last spiritual wind begins to blow? Will you be anchored in truth or swept away by delusion? The answer doesn't depend on tomorrow. It depends on what you decide today.

This is the hour to wake up. This is the moment to prepare because the last spiritual shift is not coming. It's here. We are standing on the edge of something eternal. There are moments in history when God speaks louder, not because his voice changes, but because the world grows noisier. And right now, we are in one of those moments. You don't need to be a prophet to see that the world is shifting, that the ground beneath our spiritual feet is moving. And the question that must echo through every heart is simple. but eternally important. Are we heading toward a great awakening or a great falling away?

There's a battle happening in the spirit realm, a war between truth and deception, between the eternal and the temporary, between light and darkness. The Bible tells us in 2 Thessalonians 2:3 that before the man of lawlessness, the Antichrist, appears there will be a great falling away, a rebellion, a turning from truth, a denial of the very foundations that once held families, churches, and nations together. And I believe with all my heart that we are seeing the beginnings of that shift right now.

But at the same time, while some fall away, others are waking up. That's the beauty of God's mercy. The Holy Spirit is calling a remnant, a people who won't bow, who won't compromise. This is the last shift before the final hour. God is giving people a chance to wake up, to stand up, and to speak out.

As this spiritual shift accelerates, as the world moves closer to prophetic fulfillment, you and I will not be able to sit on the fence anymore. There will be no middle ground. We will either draw near to God or drift into deception. We will either be part of the remnant or part of the rebellion. And it won't be decided in the headlines or the pulpit. It will be decided in your heart. In the quiet moments, in the secret places, in your prayers, in your choices when no one is watching. The great awakening begins there. So does the great falling away.

I believe a fire is coming. Not a fire of destruction, but a fire of purification. A fire that will refine the faithful and expose the false. And the ones who endure will shine like gold, tested but true, broken but believing. This is not a time to be silent. This is not a time to blend in. This is a time to stand out, not with arrogance, but with conviction. Because the world isn't just confused. It's spiritually starved. It's thirsty for something real, something eternal. And you, child of God, carry that truth.

You are the light of the world. And light that is hidden does no good. Now is the time to burn bright, to live holy, to love deeply, and to speak boldly. And let me tell you, this awakening, this revival that is beginning is not going to be about buildings filled with crowds. It's going to be about hearts filled with repentance. It won't be driven by famous preachers. It will be led by humble believers. Mothers praying over their children. Teenagers laying down their phones and picking up their Bibles. Fathers returning to their spiritual posts. Churches rediscovering the altar. It's not flashy. It's not glamorous, but it's powerful and it's coming.

So, I ask you again, will you be part of the awakening? Or will you be swept away by the falling away? The choice is yours and the time is short. There is no room for apathy in this hour. No space for lukewarm faith. Either you're pressing in or you're falling back. And the enemy doesn't need to get you to hate God. He just needs to get you to forget Him. That's how the falling away begins. Quietly, slowly, gradually. But the Spirit of God is louder today. He's calling you higher, deeper. closer. The last shift is here. The world is preparing for the arrival of the false Messiah. But heaven is preparing for the return of the true one. Jesus Christ is coming again. The clock is ticking, and the trumpet will soon sound.

Let your heart be found faithful. Let your soul burn with holy fire. Let your life be a light in the darkness. Because this is not just a spiritual moment. It's an eternal one. And the spirit is still whispering, "Awake, O sleeper. The time has come to rise." There is a kind of darkness that **wears the mask of light**. This is the deception of the last days, and it is more dangerous than any war, more subtle than any political scheme. It is spiritual counterfeit at its **most convincing**.

The Antichrist will not rise by force. He will rise through fascination. He will not look evil. He will look like an answer. Many imagine the Antichrist as a terrifying figure, monstrous and obvious. But the Bible paints a different picture. He will be charming, persuasive, and admired by the world. Revelation tells us he will come with signs and wonders that will deceive even the elect, if that were possible, and this deception doesn't begin on the day he arrives, it begins now.

The atmosphere for his arrival is already being prepared. Truth is being redefined. Morality is being rewritten. Unity is being exalted. But without Christ at the center. And this, beloved, is the greatest danger of all. We are witnessing a world that is being conditioned to welcome a lie that looks like peace. The enemy has studied humanity for centuries. He knows we long for hope, for healing, for justice, for unity. So, he crafts a message that sounds holy but is rooted in pride. He offers peace but not through the prince of peace. He speaks of love, but it is a love without repentance. He preaches inclusion but it excludes holiness. It sounds like light, but it is a shadow that draws people further from God.

Jesus warned us of this very thing in Matthew 24. He said many would come in his name claiming I am the Christ and would deceive many. He told us false prophets would rise and perform signs to deceive. He said the love of many would grow cold. These words are not distant prophecies. They are now headlines. People are hungry for spiritual experience but reject biblical truth. They chase miracles but avoid the cross. They desire power but not surrender. And this is the fertile ground in which deception flourishes. What makes this deception so deadly is that it does not look like rebellion. It looks like revival. It will appeal to emotions, flatter the intellect, and soothe the conscience. It will say believe whatever you want, just be sincere. It will say you don't need to change. Just be your true self.

But let me tell you something. The gospel does not exist to make us feel good. It exists to make us new. And any message that offers light without the lamp of God's word is a counterfeit. It may shine for a moment, but it will lead to darkness. The Antichrist's greatest weapon will not be war. It will be persuasion. He will offer the world what they want. peace without Jesus, miracles without holiness, religion without the cross, and those who are not grounded in scripture, who do not walk in the spirit, who are not in intimate fellowship with the Lord, will fall for it. Because deception doesn't come with horns. It comes with a hallow. It mimics the light so closely that only the truly discerning can detect the difference.

So, how do we stay anchored? By living in the word of God like our lives depend on it, because they do. This is not the time for shallow faith. It's not the time to survive on a verse a day. We need to be saturated in scripture. We need to test every spirit. We need to hold every voice against the voice of Jesus Christ. If it doesn't align with the Bible, it's not from God. No matter how inspiring it sounds, the Holy Spirit does not contradict the Word He inspired. Let us not forget that the first temptation in the garden came not through violence, but through suggestion. Did God really say that one question planted the seed of rebellion? And the enemy still uses that same tactic today. He plants doubt, not through confrontation but through confusion. He takes what is sacred and twists it until it is palatable to the flesh. He creates a gospel that requires no cross, no surrender, no sanctification, and the world eats it up.

But here is the good news. While deception may increase, so does discernment for those who walk with the spirit. God has not left us defenseless. He gives wisdom to those who ask. He leads his children by his voice. And the closer we draw to Him, the clearer the counterfeit becomes. When you know the real Jesus, the fake ones cannot fool you. When you have tasted the truth, nothing less will satisfy.

We are being prepared. Just as the world is being prepared for the Antichrist, the church is being prepared for the return of Jesus Christ. While one spirit promotes unity without truth, another calls for truth with love. One spirit builds a false kingdom of man; the other is preparing a holy bride for the King of Kings. Which one are you listening to? The clock is ticking. The signs are increasing, but don't let fear grip your heart. Let faith rise instead. This is the time to be bold in truth, gentle in spirit, and unwavering in conviction. This is the time to shine with a holy fire that exposes every counterfeit. Because when deception looks like light, only the true light of Christ can cut through the illusion.

So, I say to you, stay awake, stay rooted, stay pure. The world will chase the man who promises everything but offers nothing. But we follow the one who gave everything and offers eternity, and He's coming back soon. Don't be deceived by the imitation. Keep your eyes on the real Savior. His name is Jesus, and his truth never changes. There is a cry echoing from heaven in this final hour. It's not a call for louder worship, bigger crowds or better programs. It's a call for holiness. A call for the church, not the building, but the people of God to return to the sacred, to the set apart, to the pure heart and the narrow path. Because before the antichrist takes his throne, the church must take her stand, and she cannot do that while covered in compromise.

The days of casual Christianity are over. The days of convenience, comfort, and cultural approval are slipping away. What remains now is a church that must be refined by fire. We are approaching the threshold where the name of Christ will no longer bring applause, but opposition. And in that hour only those who are

holy will be ready. Not perfect. No. For we are all in need of grace, but holy in that we are wholly his. Separated from the world, devoted to his truth, surrendered in heart and life. Holiness is not a suggestion. It is a command. God said, "Be holy, for I am holy." That hasn't changed.

Yet in recent years, the message of holiness has been replaced with one of happiness. We have turned sanctuaries into stages, pastors into performers, and sermons into motivational talks that rarely pierce the heart. We've grown skilled at entertaining goats while the sheep starve for righteousness. But God is not calling us to popularity. He's calling us to purity. Because the bridegroom is coming and he will not marry a bride dressed in the garments of this world. Look at the early church. They didn't have lights, cameras, or platforms. What they had was power. They had prayer. They had unity. They had trembling reverence for the presence of God. They walked in holiness because they feared the Lord more than they feared man. And because of that, they turned the world upside down. Today, we have turned the church inside out, trying to make it fit into the image of a world that's headed for judgment. But judgment does not begin in the streets. It begins in the house of God.

You see, holiness is not legalism. It is not a list of rules to follow so you can be better than someone else. Holiness is intimacy. It's closeness with God that causes you to let go of everything that grieves His Spirit. It's not about what you have to give up. It's about what you've already gained in Christ. And when you've tasted the holiness of God, the taste of sin becomes bitter. The closer you get to the light, the more clearly you see what doesn't belong in your life.

But sadly, the church has flirted with the world for too long. We've tolerated what God hates. We've excused what he condemns. We've silenced the voice of conviction in exchange for the applause of men. We've softened the gospel until it demands nothing, costs nothing, and changes nothing. And in doing so, we've raised up a generation that knows how to sing, but not how to surrender. We know how to quote Scripture, but not how to obey it. We speak of grace, but forget that grace teaches us to say no to ungodliness. This is not a time for lukewarm faith. Jesus said in Revelation that He would rather you be hot or cold, but if you are lukewarm, He will spit you out. That is a sobering warning, not to the unbeliever, but to the church. A church that has grown indifferent. A church that looks busy, but is barren. A church that has lost the awe of God.

But I believe with all my heart that God is raising up a remnant, a people who are not impressed by the world, but are possessed by His Spirit. a people who are hungry for righteousness, who long to be vessels of holiness. You may feel like you're the only one standing, but you're not. Elijah thought he was alone, too, until God reminded him that He had preserved 7,000 who had not bowed their knee to bow. And He is doing it again. There is a generation rising, not defined by age, but by hunger. They may not have the biggest churches or the brightest lights, but they carry the weight of heaven. Their prayers shake the gates of hell. Their tears water the soil of revival. Their lives are marked by holiness, not as an accessory, but as their identity. And make no mistake, holiness will cost you something. You may lose friends. You may face rejection. You may be misunderstood. But what you gain in the presence of God is worth every sacrifice. Holiness may not fill stadiums, but it fills the heart of God. It may not trend on social media, but it shakes the heavens. And it prepares you not just for survival in the last days, but for victory.

So, I say to you, church of Jesus Christ, rise up and return. Return to the altar. Return to your first love. Return to the place where holiness wasn't an option. It was your lifeline. The hour is too late for half-hearted faith. The darkness is too thick for dim lights. The deception is too strong for shallow roots. Now is the time to go deeper. Now is the time to cleanse our hearts, lift holy hands, and walk the narrow path that leads to life. The world is not waiting for a church that looks like it. The world is longing, aching for a church that looks like Christ – Holy, set apart, burning with truth, overflowing with grace, drenched in power. This is the church that will stand in the last spiritual shift. This is the bride that the Bridegroom is returning for. And his, dear friend, is who you were always meant to be.

There is a sound in the spirit that only those who are awake can hear. It is not the sound of chaos in the streets, not the clamor of politics or the confusion of culture. It is deeper, quieter, but louder than thunder to the soul that walks with God. It is the alarm of lawlessness, a signal that the end is drawing near. It is not just society unraveling. It is prophecy unfolding. And if you're paying attention, you can feel it in your bones.

The Apostle Paul under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit warned in 2 Thessalonians 2:7 that the mystery of lawlessness is already at work. And what we are seeing today is the acceleration of that mystery. Lawlessness is no longer hidden. It is public. It is celebrated. It is organized. And it is increasing. But here's what we must understand. This lawlessness is not merely political rebellion or social disorder. It is spiritual at its root. It is rebellion against God's order. It is the deliberate dismantling of the design of heaven. We're not just witnessing crime in the streets. We're watching hearts turn cold. What was once unthinkable is now normal. Children are being taught confusion. Families are being torn apart. Life is no longer sacred. Truth is no longer absolute. Morality is being treated as opinion. And in the middle of all this, many believers are becoming desensitized, numb, silent. But that is not what we were called to be.

This rise in lawlessness is not meant to terrify the church. It is meant to awaken her. God never reveals the signs of the times so we can live in fear. He reveals them so we can live with urgency, with clarity, and with holiness. The increase of sin is a sign that grace must increase even more in our lives. The louder the darkness gets, the brighter our light must shine. Lawlessness is a signal. And what it's signaling is that the Antichrist spirit is preparing its stage. This is the climate he thrives in. Confusion, division, a society with no anchor, no truth, and no sense of sacred. And so, the spiritual alarm sounds not with bells but with brokenness with that stirring in your soul that says this is not how it's supposed to be. That ache that longs for righteousness to return. That groan of the Spirit inside you that cries out come Lord Jesus.

The rise of lawlessness is not just a judgment on the world. It is a test for the church. Will we conform or will we confront? Will we compromise or will we stand? Will we echo the crowd or will we carry the cross? These are the questions we must answer. Not someday but today. Because lawlessness is not just coming from the world. It's creeping into the pews. It's softening our convictions. It's making us choose relevance over reverence. And if we don't wake up now, we'll find ourselves swept away by the very tide we were called to resist.

So, when you hear the sound of lawlessness, when you feel that grief in your spirit, that anger at injustice, that sorrow for sin, don't ignore it. That's your spiritual alarm clock. That's heaven shaking you awake. That's the Holy Spirit saying, "Stay ready. Stay pure. Stay alert because Jesus is coming soon. And when He comes, He's not coming for a sleeping church. He's coming for a ready bride.

The rise of lawlessness is not the end. It's the beginning of the final chapter. It's the countdown before the King returns. And while the world prepares for a false savior, the true church is preparing for the real one. So, take heart. Be bold. Stay awake. And above all, let your love for God burn hotter than the chaos around you. Because the spiritual alarm is sounding. And those with ears to hear must rise.

Right now, there is a flood of confusion across the earth. Political voices shout over each other. Cultural ideologies change by the hour. The world tells us to follow our hearts, but the Bible tells us the heart is deceitful above all things. This is why we cannot rely on emotion. We cannot trust our feelings. We need the Holy Spirit because He alone guides us into all truth. He reveals what is hidden. He prepares us for what is coming. And in a world spinning faster into deception, it is only those filled with Him who will remain unshaken.

In the book of Acts, the early church was not sustained by clever strategies or comfort. They were sustained by the Holy Spirit. They prayed in the Spirit. They walked in the Spirit. They obeyed the Spirit. That's why they had power. That's why they had boldness. And that's why they had discernment. They weren't caught off guard by persecution. They weren't confused by spiritual opposition. They knew the times because they knew the voice of their Shepherd. The same must be true of us. If we are to endure what lies ahead and more than endure, if we are to overcome, we must be Spirit-filled people. That means our lives must no longer be dictated by the flesh. We cannot live according to what we see with our physical eyes or hear with our natural ears. We must live by what the Spirit of God shows us. He is not silent. He is not distant. He is speaking even now. But only the Spirit-filled or tuned in to hear Him.

Being filled with the Spirit isn't about a moment. It's about a lifestyle. It's not an emotional high. It's a continual surrender. It means every decision, every word, every action is submitted to the leading of the Holy Spirit. It means we don't just visit God on [the Sabbath]. We walk with Him every day. It means our hearts are tender to conviction. Our minds are renewed by the Word. Our eyes are fixed on eternity. And our spirits are alert to the hour in which we live.

Discernment doesn't mean you'll know every detail of what's to come. But it does mean you'll recognize the season. Jesus rebuked the Pharisees in Matthew 16 for being able to interpret the sky, but not the signs of the times. They had Scripture. They had religion, but they didn't have revelation. And in these last days, that is the danger for many in the church. We can quote the Bible without hearing the voice behind it. We can preach the truth without living it. We can recognize the Antichrist's arrival on paper, but not recognize his spirit already at work.

The Spirit-filled believer is not swayed by headlines. They are anchored in heaven's timeline. They are not panicked by crisis because their peace comes from Christ. They are not seduced by the world's applause because they live for a higher calling. And when deception increases, and it will, they will not be deceived because the Spirit within them will raise up a standard of truth. The Spirit does not lead us into fear. He leads us into faith. He doesn't blind us. He opens our eyes. This is why we must return to the altar. This is why we must be still before the Lord and listen again. **Not for noise, not for hype**, but for his whisper.

The hour is late. The world is preparing for the man of sin, but the church must prepare for the return of the Son of Man. And we cannot do that in our own strength. We must be filled fully and continually with the

Spirit of the living God. There's no time for halfhearted religion. There's no room for spiritual apathy. The enemy isn't playing games, but neither is heaven. We are not powerless. We are not abandoned. We have been equipped with the very Spirit that raised Christ from the dead. And He lives in us. That means we are not victims of the times. We are victors through Christ in the times.

So, I urge you, seek Him while He may be found. Let your lamp be filled with oil. Let your heart be free of compromise. Let your ears be tuned to the Shepherd's voice because those who are filled with the Spirit will not be caught off guard when the sky splits open. They will be ready, watching and longing for the return of their King. Time is no longer moving slowly. It's rushing. The final pieces are falling into place. The spiritual shift has already begun. And whether we feel ready or not, the line between darkness and light is being drawn with divine precision.

The world is not just changing, it is being positioned. The lawless one is soon to be revealed. And every sign, every warning, every trembling in the atmosphere is shouting what heaven has already whispered. Prepare the way of the Lord. You cannot afford to be neutral. You cannot afford to wait for a better time. The days of passive faith are over. This is the hour to rise, to shake off the dust of apathy, to come out of compromise, to silence every voice that doesn't sound like truth. The deception is growing stronger and the counterfeit is becoming more convincing. But God has never left his people without a compass. He has given us his Spirit, His Word, and His voice. The question is, will you listen? A great awakening is being offered. But many will choose the great falling away. And the difference won't be found in what we say. It will be seen in what we do, in how we live, in what we obey, in how tightly we cling to the presence of God in a world pulling us in a thousand directions.

You can't rely on yesterday's oil. You can't survive on inherited faith. You need your own fire, your own altar, your own encounter with the living Christ. This is not the time to fear. It's the time to burn. To burn with truth. To burn with holiness. To burn with love that isn't shallow but sacrificial. Love that endures. Love that confronts sin and still kneels to serve. Love that looks like Jesus in a world that's preparing to follow anyone but Him. This is the time to break every agreement you've made with comfort and make a covenant with conviction because the spirit of the antichrist is not coming. It's already here. It is subtle. It is seductive. It is strategic and it will deceive many who never rooted themselves in the truth.

But you do not have to be one of them. You can be different. You can be ready. You can be holy, bold, and burning with discernment because you have the Spirit of the living God inside you. So, what must you do? Get into the Word like your life depends on it. Because it does. Fall on your knees until your heart beats with heaven again. Repent of everything that dulls your spirit. Speak truth even if your voice shakes and walk so close to Jesus that nothing in this world can pull you away. God is not looking for perfect people. He is looking for surrendered ones. Not the loudest, not the most popular, but the most yielded. Those who are willing to say, "Lord, whatever it takes, I want to be found faithful." That's the remnant He's preparing. That's the bride He's returning for. And that can be you!
