Received MARCs radio grant money from the State Fire Marshall's Office.

Mr. Patrick reported Ford paid \$200 of the tow bill for the plow truck; Sarchionne's to bill for the balance.

Trustees

Mr. Lange spoke with Mr. Bencze regarding motorcycle track's non-conforming use when the track was unused for more than 2 years; letters have been mailed through the Common Pleas Court; the letter sent to Newton Falls address was returned; have not heard anything from the letter sent to Streetsboro address. Waiting for the owner to respond.

Received quote from Portage Awning for 4 panels to finish the west side of the pavilion.
