We offer many affordability programs to assist Baltimore City residents with water bill payments. From monthly discounts to payment plans, we likely have an affordability program that can help!

Here is information on our current programs.

Water4All

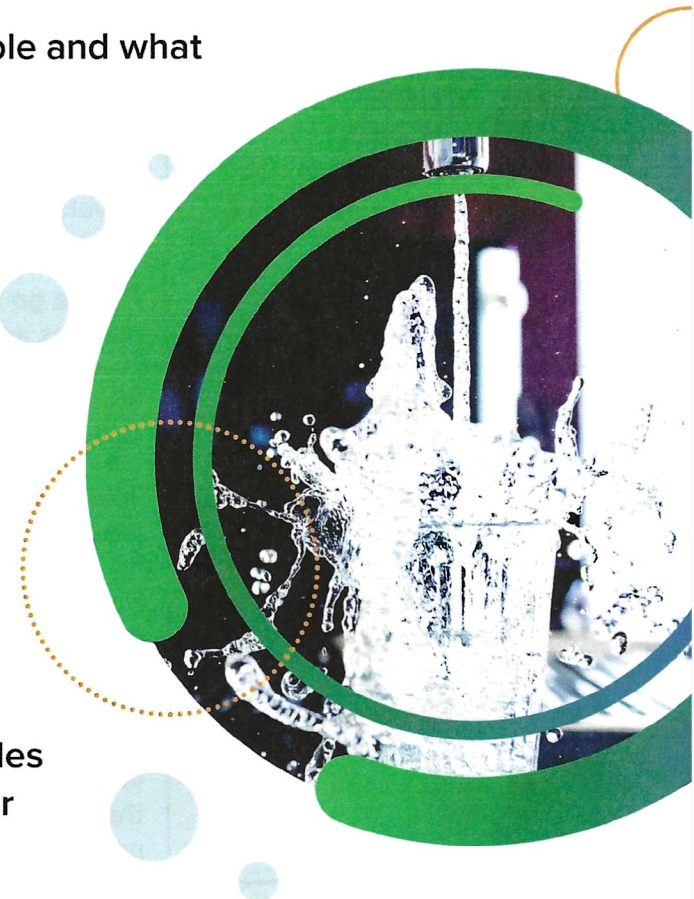
Water4All is a new water bill discount program designed to create more equitable access to financial assistance for more Baltimore City residents. For eligible customers, Water4All provides a discount on your current water bill based on your income level.

PromisePay Payment Plans

The City of Baltimore recently partnered with Promise to bring PromisePay payment plans to Baltimore City Department of Public Works' (DPW) customers who are behind on their water bills. Any residential customer account in Baltimore City with a past due balance of \$250 to \$5000 is eligible to enroll in a convenient, flexible, and interest free PromisePay payment plan.

State of Maryland's Low Income Household Assistance Program

Maryland's Low Income Household Assistance Program (LIHWAP) provides free money to help eligible low income households pay water and wastewater bills. LIHWAP provides up to \$2,000 to pay off past due or current water and wastewater bills.
