In anticipation if this project, your child has brought home a paper chick to decorate with your family. Instructions for this chick decorating project were included. Paper chicks should be returned to school by April 1st, so that we can display them before our brood hatches.



Vision Screening

The Bucks County Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired will be at school in late April for voluntary vision screening. Donations are encouraged. Look for info/consent forms to come home in folders. No child can be screened without a signed consent. With their new tool, the screening takes approximately 30 seconds per child and is a very valuable opportunity.



Just a reminder that children who are experiencing any Covid-like symptoms cannot attend school unless cleared by a physician/negative Covid test, or 5 days have passed since symptom onset. Individuals who are cleared for school but still experiencing cold symptoms must be able to efficiently cover coughs/sneezes with the insides of their elbows, and manage noses independently. If this respiratory etiquette is not secure, a mask is required and will be provided, if needed.
