## Tips from the Teachers

Here are a few helpful hints that will make for an easier transition to school for your child: Show your enthusiasm about the school experience! If you are excited and confident, your child will be, too!

<sup>≪</sup>Make your goodbyes simple, **quick**, and **cheerfu**l! Make a 'Drop-Off' plan and stick to it©. Remember, you can call us and see how they're doing, if drop-off was tough.

\*Please remember to keep your cell phone on and with you while your child is at school. This is the fastest and easiest way for us to reach you!

\*Please empty your child's backpack and check their folder <u>after each class session</u>. Take time to discuss the projects created by your child. They worked really hard and are SUPER excited to talk about ALL the details! We think you'll start to notice the connection they make to discussions they've had during 'Circle-Time', the review of new concepts and skills they're learning and the reinforcement of curriculum.

Keep school clothes as simple and manageable as possible. Easy, simple clothing makes potty visits much easier and encourages independence. Remember <u>sneakers</u> or <u>rubber soled shoes</u> are the safest choice for school activities. Always be sure to keep a <u>complete</u>, <u>extra set of clothes</u> in a bag in your child's backpack with their name labeled inside.

 $\overset{\&}{\sim}$ Be patient in these first few weeks of school, as we are all learning new school routines. Most importantly, revel in the carefree innocence of your preschooler!



While staying connected to your cell phone is important, we would like to remind you that our car loop and pick-up area are "No Phone Zones". It is extremely important that you focus all your attention on the moving cars and pedestrians in the car line, specifically our little ones. Upon pick-up, greet your child with undivided attention, as you cross the busy parking lot, until they are safely buckled in their car seats. On many days, other classes are arriving for lunch as morning classes are dismissing. The parking lot can be a very busy place and safety is our utmost concern!
