Of all times, it's more important than ever that we find strength and comfort in one another. Not only do we need each other, but our extended community needs us too.

October 7th was a wake-up call for many of us, but I do believe that it has served as a call to action as well. This call to action has directly led to the creation of the SGBJC. Our Jewish community has grown from 40 or so members at the first meeting to over 300 adult members residing in this area. As with any large scale passion project, we have steadily developed an executive board consisting of 8 dedicated members, whom without, nothing would be possible. I would like to extend a big thank you to my husband Dr. Michael Feldman, Peter Seligman, Monique Szigeti, Cindy Chisvin, Amanda Levine, Dr. Rebecca Henry and Dr. David Yanowski. Together we have worked to achieve some important goals including but not limited to:

- Deputations at four local town councils on antisemitism, with the Town of Collingwood and Town of Wasaga Beach officially adopting the IHRA definition of antisemitism as their public position
- The placement of a menorah in the Town of Collingwood city hall window and displaying it alongside the Christmas decorations
- Three community meetings
- The inauguration of an executive committee

- Starting a kids and teens Jewish social and educational program including a Challah bake, a Tikkun Olam event, a kids' Seder, a Shabbat Potluck, a Purim party and hamantaschen bake.

Planning for this coming year is already well underway. We plan to host our first Rosh Hashanah service on October 3rd, live streaming the Park Avenue Synagogue service in New York at the Simcoe Street Theatre. We are also working on plans for a Kol Nidre service at the Thornbury L.E. Shore Memorial Library on October 11th. Seating is limited at both of these venues, so stay tuned for attached details if you wish to reserve a seat. We are also hoping to have a Family Rosh Hashanah apple picking at The Farmer's Pantry on the Mountain on September 29th.

Later in the year, we are working with two local high schools to bring the Friends of Simon Weisenthal Centre's Tour of Humanity bus, an award-winning mobile human rights education centre. In the hopes of "teaching students about the horrors of genocide, especially the Holocaust, while addressing issues of racism, intolerance, diversity, democracy and human rights".

We are organizing a series of social events to have opportunities to meet, hang out, and enjoy good food and wine, a Hanukkah party, Shabbat potlucks, movie nights, and develop an educational series on history and current events open to our Jewish community members and the community at large. We also plan to continue our local advocacy to support our community and stand firm against antisemitism. We also hope to select a worthy cause and raise the profile of the Southern Georgian Bay Jewish Community by helping recruit volunteers or raising money for a local charity.

We have incorporated a public, not-for-profit corporation to manage the finances of arranging for all these activities. It is our hope to now be able to apply for funding that would greatly help us to cover these costs as well as future costs of continuing to build opportunities for our community.

In order for our organization to pay for the necessary administrative expenses we have decided to introduce an annual fee beginning this new year of \$180 per household. We are willing to accommodate anyone who finds themselves in financial hardship and cannot pay the fee but still wishes to be part of the SGBJC. As we prepare for the year ahead (5785) let us be mindful that we still have at least 97 hostages remaining in Gaza, and that Jewish communities around the world are experiencing a dramatic rise of antisemitism. 
