## Materials used and explored

Material explored: Rope

Rope signifies a bound, unfree and restricted predicament, akin to the brutalist structure.. Throughout my project, I use light as a metaphor for the American Dream. I want to show the so-called "golden light" hidden behind an ethos

Material:Plaster bandage

I decided to use plaster bandages as one of the main materials for the structure that would hold the light bulb. I envisioned the plaster bandage as representing as the soul of a creator. After experimenting with the bulb, I realized that the textures of the bandage create a sense of a dimmed light within the human soul.

Material: Clay

I use clay for its moldable yet rigid nature. I wanted to use clay in the form of ants, who represent the benifitters of the economic society or the business class.
