

A New Set of Alphabetical Indexes for *Backpocket Words: Sharing the Essence of English Spelling*

- An index of the base elements in the book
- An index of selected words discussed
- An index of the Latin, Greek, Old English and French etymons cited
- A general index of linguistic terms and concepts

I have formatted these indexes just like the book itself so that you can print them out, trim them to size and tuck them into the back of your copy.

Now you will be able to find your way back to any particular word, base, etymon, or linguistic term/concept that piqued your interest as you were reading: Where did I see those two-letter base elements <ge> and <me>? Where did I find derivatives of the Latin verb *capere* discussed? Where were those investigations of “dysentery” and “diarrhea”? What were the examples of homographic bases where one was bound and another free? Where did the words “bureaucracy” or “intransigence” appear? These indexes will answer such questions!
