Welcome Autumn!

September 22, 2022 was the first day of Fall and marks the Autumn Equinox. *Fun Facts:*

Both equinoxes and solstices only happen twice a year — the first days of fall and spring are equinoxes, while the first days of summer and winter are solstices.

How are they different?

What is an equinox?

On the day of an equinox, the Earth is tilting neither toward or away from the sun, and therefore receives almost an equal amount of daylight and darkness, according to the National Weather Service. At places along the equator, the sun is directly overhead at about noon on these days. Day and night appear to be equal due to the bending of the sun's rays, which makes the sun appear above the horizon when it is actually below it.

During an equinox, days are slightly longer in places with higher latitudes. At the equator, daylight may last for about 12 hours and seven minutes. But at a place with 60 degrees of latitude, such as the North Pole, a day is about 12 hours and 16 minutes.

What is a solstice?

On the day of a solstice, the Earth is at its maximum tilt, 23.5 degrees, either toward or away from the sun.

During a summer solstice, the sun is directly above the Tropic of Cancer in the Northern Hemisphere and is tilting toward the sun, causing the longest day of the year. It is winter in the Southern Hemisphere, where the Earth is tilting away from the sun.

Likewise, a winter solstice happens in the Northern Hemisphere when the hemisphere is tilting away from the sun, making it the day with the least amount of sunlight. The sun is above the Tropic of Capricorn in the southern hemisphere, making it summer there.

Notice of Hughes-Elizabeth Lakes Union School District Board Vacancy

To be eligible, the applicant must be a resident of Area 1 or Area 2 and a registered voter in the Hughes-Elizabeth Lakes Union School District, at least 18 years of age, a citizen of the United States and California, and not legally disqualified from holding civil office. Any person who has been convicted of a felony involving the giving, accepting or offering of a bribe, embezzlement or theft of public funds, extortion, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any such crime, under California law or the law of another state, the United States of America, or another country, is not eligible to be a candidate for office or be a Board member except when he/she has been granted a pardon in accordance with law. (Education Code 35107; Elections Code 20)

Interested persons must submit a letter of interest and Candidate Information Sheet to the Superintendent's office, Hughes-Elizabeth Lakes Union School District, 16633 Elizabeth Lake Road, Lake Hughes CA 93532 no later than 3:30 p.m. on October 20, 2022.

Following a review of submitted materials, the Superintendent and Board will schedule interviews with selected candidates. One individual will be appointed to fill the vacant position in Area 1 and the vacant position in Area 2. The selected individuals will fill the four year term for that Board Seat.

Bus Driver Shortage

As a result of losing our bus driver as of September 6, 2022, we are asking parents to continue to drive their student/students to school. Until we are able to find a bus driver, we are asking you to provide alternate transportation for your student(s). If you are unable to provide transportation please contact the office so they are aware and will help in getting every child to school. When your child misses school because of lack of transportation, the absence would be excused, and the student(s) will have the opportunity to complete any missed assignments. Please check with your student's teacher to find the appropriate location for those assignments if you need assistance. We recognize this is an inconvenience for the students and families impacted. Our goal is to find the bus driver replacement as soon as we can. This decision was not easily made and is certainly a last resort. We know the best place for our students during the school day is to be with their teachers, learning in-person. We have exhausted all other options prior to implementing these transportation changes. If further changes are needed, we will communicate this to our community.

Bus Passes and Fees

Bus fees are on hold until further notice. If you submitted your child(ren)'s bus pass dues already, you have the choice of having it returned to you. In the meantime please still apply for the free or reduced lunch program. If you qualify for the Free or Reduced Lunch Program, the RISE After School Program fees will be reduced. <u>School Attendance & Why It Is So Important!</u>

Your job as a parent is to see that your child is on time and in school every day. As it states in the HELUS Handbook, 3 tardies will equal an absence unless the tardy is cleared through a doctor's/dentist's note presented at the time of tardy. Whether your child's absence is excused or unexcused, the school loses the funding for that student for the day. Did you know that for each student that is absent HELUS loses about \$85 per day, whether the absence is excused or not. That is called ADA (Average Daily Attendance) and it is how all public schools are funded in the state of California. Please remember that good student attendance is very important and is the foundation for a great education! Good attendance fosters good citizenship, increased learning and happier students. Students who miss school miss valuable classroom lessons and fall behind their classmates. Please plan vacations and schedule appointments on non-school days or afterschool. If your child has an appointment during school, please have your child attend school in the morning before the appointment. He or she will receive attendance credit for being present. Each day a student is not at school, school funding is decreased. Your child's job is learning at school.

<u>Please note: You must provide the office a reason for your child's absence within 1 week; after that it will be marked as unexcused.</u>

Teachers fly their flag outside of their classroom door each day that they have perfect attendance. Our classes will be competing for the best attendance each week (TK/K **vs** 1st grade, 2nd grade **vs** 3rd grade, 4th grade **vs** 5th grade, and 6th grade **vs** 7/8th grade). The winner gets to keep the attendance trophy in their class until the other class beats them.

Car traffic through HELUS is heavy at Drop-off in the morning and Pick-up time in the afternoon. To help make the process safer and smoother for all involved, please make sure you are legally parked when you drop off or pick-up your child. In particular, please pull over next to the island curb to drop off upper grade students (4th-8th), and lower grade students get dropped off at the top of the hill in designated spots near the district office. Please do not block the right-of-way, driveways, bus stop zones, or parking lot exits, and do not park on the sidewalks. It is important that traffic be able to continue to move freely. Students should use extra caution when crossing the parking lot/driveway at the school. Thank you for your help in following these guidelines. Most importantly, please be patient. We appreciate your cooperation!

COVID - 19 Positive Case or Exposure: What to expect

If HELUS has a positive COVID case on campus the following will happen. A general informational notification will be sent school wide to all families. A separate isolate or quarantine notification will be sent to those in close contact to the positive person with a timeline and instructions on what to do. Students in isolation or quarantine may request a short term independent study contract to continue student learning. Students may return to school after the isolation, quarantine period, or negative test clearance.
