New Tracking for Student Participation and Engagement

The Senate Bill 98 requires that student participation and engagement be tracked daily in addition to student attendance. Teachers are required to track students' participation through the entire school day. Teachers are also required to track students' engagement through the entire school day. Students now need to earn attendance, participation and engagement credit daily. The CA Department of Education is working to reduce learning loss through the expectations that students are participating and engaged during Distance Learning. Parents please be aware that in addition to your child logging on and joining his/her class, their participation and engagement in class matters. Our quarterly attendance awards ceremonies will include acknowledging students participation and engagement.

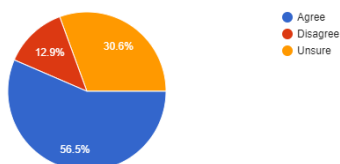
Planning Committee for Students Return To Campus

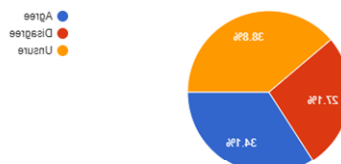
