REPIPE PROJECT

As California moves further in the Resilience Roadmap (https://covid19.ca.gov/roadmap/). Business' are taking steps to reduce the risk of COVID-19. On May 8th, the Governor outlined a process where counties who met specific criteria could move more quickly than other parts of the state through Stage 2 of modifying the Stay-at-Home order. Now again on June 12th the state has also begun to transition into phase 3. Since the additional state guidelines have been announced we are moving forward once again with the Re-pipe project.

Pool Update

Prior to reopening and operating, we are required by the county to ensure that pool users can continue to follow any Public Health Orders that remain in place and the guidelines can be achieved to prevent any pool safety risks. This isnt as easy as just opening the gate and we're back to what was 'normal'.



As of June 12th the county has provided additional guidelines as part of the State's Resilience Roadmap and we are now in a place where implementation can be informed by what is feasible, practical, and acceptable. Any assumption that the pool was being kept closed without cause is unfortunate. We have been working with our property management to remain in contact with the county health officer for approval and to do whats best for the residents, to keep everyone safe and follow the law.

The recommended effective date was <u>no sooner</u> than June 12, 2020. As residents, board members are eager to reopen all facilities as soon as it is safe to do so, following all safety guidelines and governmental directives. We anticipate we will have the necessary maintenance schedule in place and an annoucement by the next HOA Board mtg. Please check the clubhouse bulletin board for updates.

Hazardous Household Waste Disposal

Orange County has a hazardous waste disposal program for County residents. Knowing about proper disposal of household hazardous waste is important. For both the potential effects on our environment and the health and safety of your family. Examples of household hazardous materials include everyday products for our homes, yards and autos.

These items include:

Drain cleaners
Oil based paints
Motor oil
Antifreeze

Fuels (gasoline, kerosene, "white gas", etc.)

Poisons

Pesticide

Additionally, items like batteries, fluorescent lamps, lamp ballasts, smoke detectors and consumer electronics, including televisions, computers and cell phones are classified as hazardous household waste. Through the OC Waste & Recycling department, the County provides four free Household Hazardous Waste Collection Centers.
