Most all of the tips to prevent illness recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are an individual responsibility:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay in when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Follow CDC's recommendations for using a face covering.
- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

The 2020 Census is happening now. You can respond online, by phone, or by mail. https://2020census.gov/en.html.

As mandated by the U.S. Constitution, the federal Census Bureau conducts a nationwide population count once every 10 years. This is one of the few national activities the American public does together. It's also easy, confidential and critically important to our students and their communities. Our current circumstances show just how resources from the national government are important for the health and well-being of everyone. The COVID-19 crisis makes participation more important than ever. Accurate census figures enable local governments and health care systems to make critical decisions in support of public safety.

### 2020 TAX DEADLINE EXTENSION

The global COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic has had major effects on the global economy and on



Americans' finances. As a result, the federal government is extending the federal income tax filing deadline from the typical April 15 due date to July 15, 2020. This relief is automatic, taxpayers do not need to file any additional forms or call the IRS to qualify. Penalties and interest will begin to accrue on any remaining unpaid balances as of July 16, 2020. You will automatically avoid interest and penalties on the taxes paid by July 15.

## \*\*Plumbing Reminder\*\*

The responsibility for maintaining many plumbing fixtures and lines remain with the condo owner, including past owner neglect, you as the current unit owner would be responsible for any damage. Blockages in common area pipes are typically the result of someone putting non-soluble particulates products in the drainage system. It is important that you take care to properly maintain your drains by not flushing inappropriate materials or allowing grease, oil or

solids into drains. Remember your disposal is NOT a garbage can. Save yourself the expense of plumbing problems by dumping your TRASH in your trashcan.

There have been reports of sewage systems and toilets clogging across the country as Americans faced with a perceived shortage of toilet paper have resorted to using baby wipes, paper towels, napkins and tissues — and flushing them away. If you're all out of toilet paper, there's no perfect



solution, but you should never flush paper towels and napkins. They don't dissolve quickly in water and are likely to cause your toilet to back up.
