The meeting was held at the end of the morning and a raffle took place raising funds for the Club. To be honest, we have no idea the names of the people who won but Troy does know what car they drive!!



SECRETARY'S REPORT

Minutes of last meeting - have been published in the "Oily Rag"

with hard copies available today for members.

Moved: A. Gallacher, Seconded: Keith Downie that minutes be accepted. Carried.

Outgoing Correspondence:

Letter to QCC re: poor support for rally and confusion over dating certificates.

Incoming correspondence:

New Membership Application - Final application from Russell & Beverly Bloomfield - Approved. This brings total financial members to 61. No more applications will be accepted.

Moved:- A. Gallacher, Seconded Peter Hobart - that Secretary's report be approved - Carried.

MATTERS ARISING

Queensland Combined Council Correspondence:

The response to our letter regarding the QCC apparent lack of support for the rally and confusion over the new dating certificate was discussed at length.

In summary, the question of our continued membership of the association was mentioned, as well as the benefit we may or may not receive from our annual membership fee - \$62.50 for 2009/10. Whilst there was a belief that our voice should be heard, there are other associations that also have a say with Queensland Roads and Traffic departments.

It was moved Ron Byrnes, seconded Craig Bloomfield to defer further discussion on this topic until our next meeting. In the meantime, copies of the reply from the QCC (now called Qld Historic Motoring Council) are to be circulated to all members for their comments and views at our next meeting. – carried.

Discussion on By-Law #1"Tenure of Office"

There had been some discussion about the possible difficulty of filling the committee positions at our AGM. An amendment covering an extension of office if no candidates appeared willing to stand had been informally discussed and was put forward for further consideration by the members.

It was the opinion of our President and other members that, as we are a small club and intend to remain that way, we should all be prepared to take our turn and make a contribution to the smooth running of our club – particularly in view of our decision to reduce our meetings to every second month after our AGM. At this point it was moved by Peter Hobart, Seconded by Denise Douglas, that the By Law re: Tenure remain unchanged – carried.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Club Xmas party:

Denise reported on her search for a suitable venue and advised that most places were charging \$25 - \$30 per head. The contribution of the club to this cost (from our raffles and membership dues) was discussed and moved Denise seconded Peter Hobart that the club should subsidise members for their continued support to a value of \$15/head - carried.

Since the location was not finally decided it was moved Geoff Norris, seconded Peter Hobart: that Denise be authorised to select a suitable venue for our Xmas Party (preferably around Caboolture area) for say 40 or so members - carried.

UPCOMING EVENTS

Craig advised there was the Narangba Swap meet on 29 & 30 August. Robert Dix advised the "Festival of Flight" on the same weekend at Toogoolawah and recommended the Saturday as a particularly good opportunity to get close to the aircraft. (Please see Page 4 for further information)

Peter Hobart has been in touch with the Lakeside Circuit management re: our attendance as a club at their next Historic Meeting. There will be Group "A" & "C" touring cars and we can have space as a club and display our banner. Numbers proposed to attend were around 15 cars. Cost is \$20 but this may be reduced.

As the above clashes with our AGM, it was formally moved by Peter Hobart, seconded by Craig Bloomfield that **the AGM be**

moved to 27th September to allow the club to attend the Lakeside circuit – carried.

October run to Tin Can Bay. Support for this run was less than expected and there were discussions re: alternative ways of having the overnighter as originally proposed and combining it with a club run to say Gympie on the Sunday for those who did not want to be away overnight. Since the date is still some 3 months away, further discussion was deferred to next meeting.

Festival of Flight 2009 weekend

Saturday 29th to Sunday 30th August

held at Watts Bridge Memorial Airfield, Silverleaves Road, Toogoolawa.

This event is the largest fly-in of vintage and warbird aircraft in Australia.

The last weekend in August heralds the return of the most diverse group of aircraft to Watts Bridge. Everything from early trainers such as Tiger Moths and Chipmunks, WWII Fighters including Mustangs and Trojans, classic Aircraft, Homebuilts, Recreational aeroplanes, Gyroplanes and general aviation. If it flies, it will be at Watts Bridge August 29th and 30th.

But as if that were not enough there are Vintage cars, trucks and motorcycles, food stalls, *a well stocked bar* and a fully catered dinner. You've just gotta be there.

If you're lucky enough (like Bob Pritchard last year) you might just get a ride in one of these classic planes for offering the services of his sons car to pump up the pilots air mattress! Meeting Place: Caboolture Lakes

Time of departure: 7.30am sharp. If there are late comers after 7.30, route sheets will be in a plastic bag tied to the tennis court fence so you can find your own way out there.
