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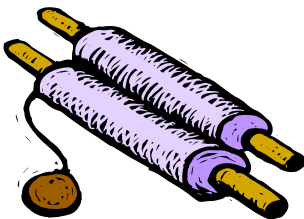

The next day the headlines read:

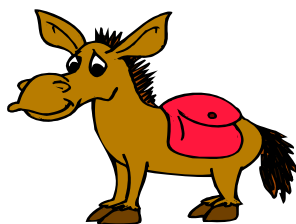
NUN ANNOUNCES HER ASS IS WILD AND FREE.

For example: The first one is “Head over Heels” – Think outside the box and a bit laterally and you should be able to get them all. We will go through them at the AGM.

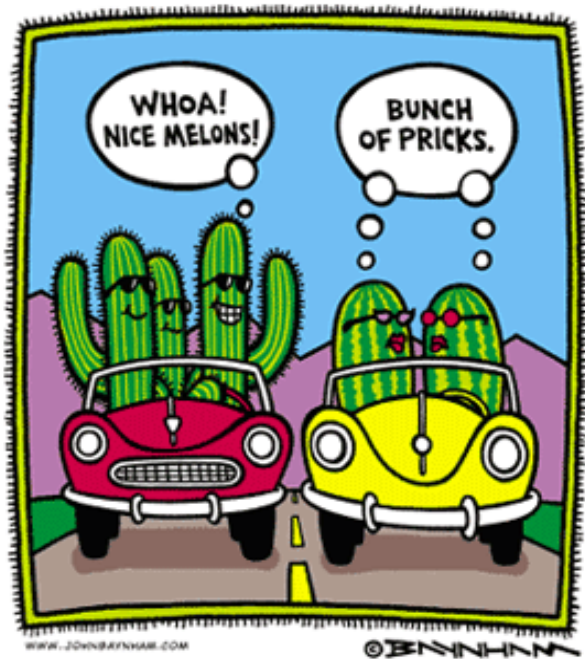
