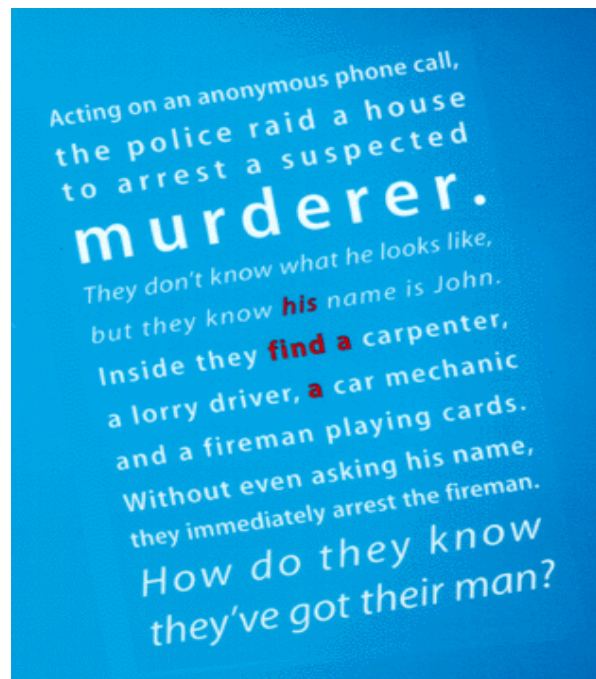
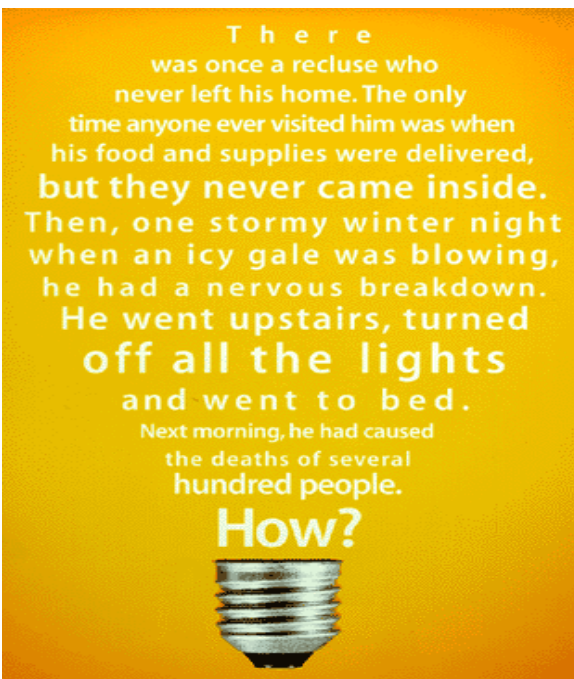
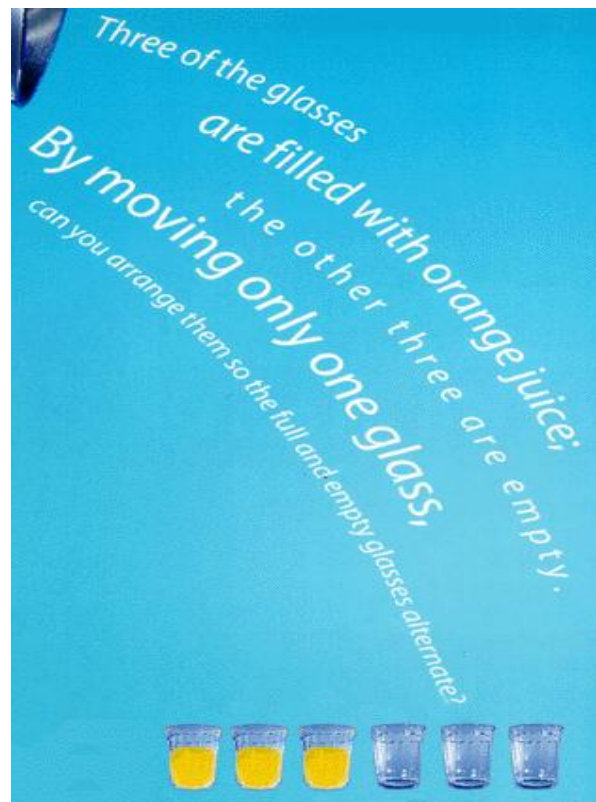
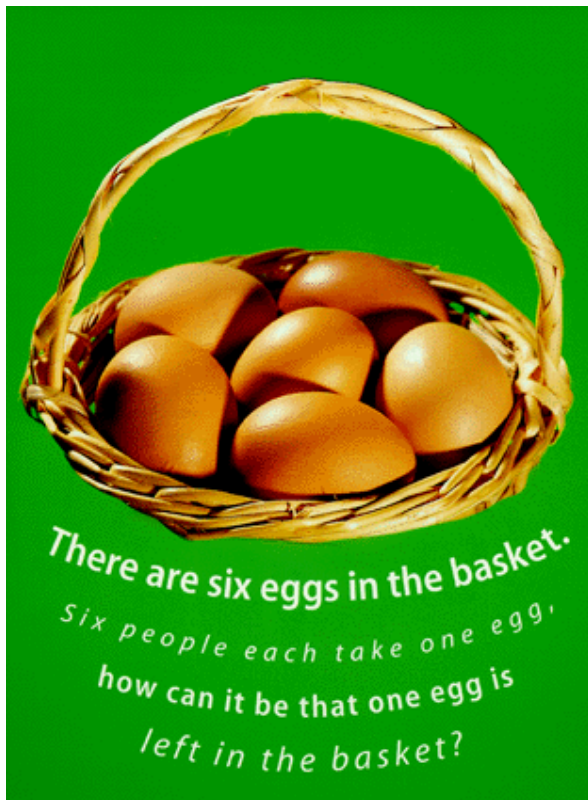
OUR **AGM** THIS YEAR IS ON **SUNDAY 16TH SEPTEMBER** – TOORBUL WATERFRONT!!

Second prize went to Michelle and Rob Dix – a great effort.

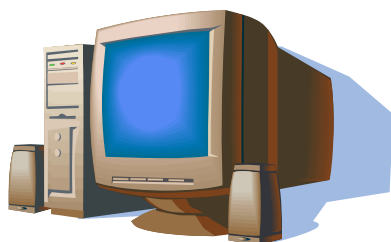

PENNE PUTTANESCA

A quick and easy pasta dish – very tasty and nutritious.

Ingredients:

2 tabs olive oil
1 large brown onion, finely chopped
2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
3 anchovy fillets, finely chopped
¼ teaspoon dried chilli flakes
2 tabs drained capers, rinsed
400g can diced tomatoes
½ cup pitted black olives, sliced (or more to taste if desired)
1 tab finely chopped fresh oregano leaves
400g dried Penne pasta
Fresh chopped parsley leaves to serve

Heat oil in a saucepan over medium heat. Add onion, garlic, anchovies, chilli and capers.

Cook stirring occasionally, for 5 minutes or until onion has softened.

Add tomato, olives and Oregano.

Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low.

Simmer for 15 minutes or until sauce has slightly thickened

Meanwhile, cook pasta in a large saucepan of boiling water (add salt to taste), following packet directions.

Cook until tender. Drain then return to pan.

Add tomato mixture. Toss to combine.

Sprinkle with Parsley. Serve
