# Wings & Wheels Fly in and Car Show Caboolture Air Field 10/11/2013

What a beautiful day for an outing, by the time some of our club cars arrived at the airfield a lot of planes were out ready for display, as well as quite a few Mustangs of all types and styles.

The Museum had its normal display of antique planes and memorabilia as well as three 1901 – 1918 replicas being built ready for flight in 2018, being the Centenary of Australian military flight.

On display was an impressive group of USA vehicles all decked out with the appropriate equipment, complete with a genuine working paratrooper's collapsible motorbike. The blokes looked the part all dressed in their period uniforms and armament. Another exciting display was the Red Baron group, some of their members wandered around in period ground staff uniform.
