Baroon Pocket Dam

Lake Baroon is located between Maleny and Montville in the Sunshine Coast hinterland and provides recreation facilities, as well as being part of South East Queensland's drinking water supply.

Baroon Pocket Dam, built across Obi Obi Creek, was completed in 1989 and is 370 metres long. The lake has a surface area of 380 hectares and at full capacity holds 61,000 megalitres of water.

It is an un-gated dam, meaning that when it reaches 100 per cent capacity, water flows over the spillway and safely out of the dam.

Lake Baroon is a quieter recreation lake, with only electric powered boats and paddle craft permitted on the water. Fishing, swimming and the surrounding trails are also popular activities.

Permits are not required for boating or fishing at Baroon.

She said, 'Oh, my God, it's too late for you!


