<u>Total income</u> for year ended 30th June 2015 was \$2,930.30 including Memberships (\$1,880), Raffles (\$418.00), Functions (\$550.30) and stock purchases(\$82.00)

Expenditure \$3,174.10. - major expense was Functions(\$1,610.45 Subsidised runs (\$794.90), Flowers(\$60.00) Club Regalia stock (\$376.00), all other

expenses (raffle prizes, donations bank fees, web site, etc) amounted to \$332.85.

Balance in Account as at 30th June 2015 - \$5,284.93.


