Graeme thanked Alec for todays run and all attendees agreed it was lovely driving through all the back roads of Caboolture and Moorina and the observation run was good fun.

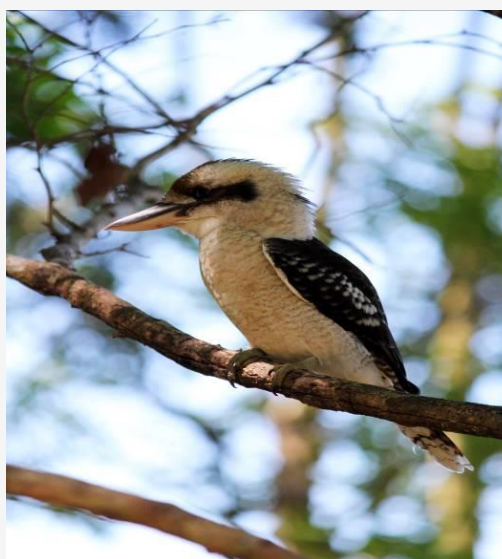
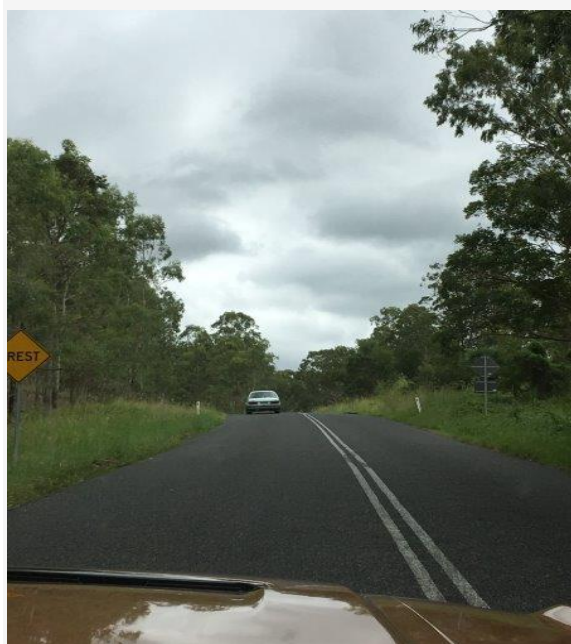
Winner of the observation run (quite a few people got all questions correct), after a tricky one off question – winners were Jeff and Cathie Trevan. Congratualtions.

Murphy says, "This year I'm taking Marion with me."

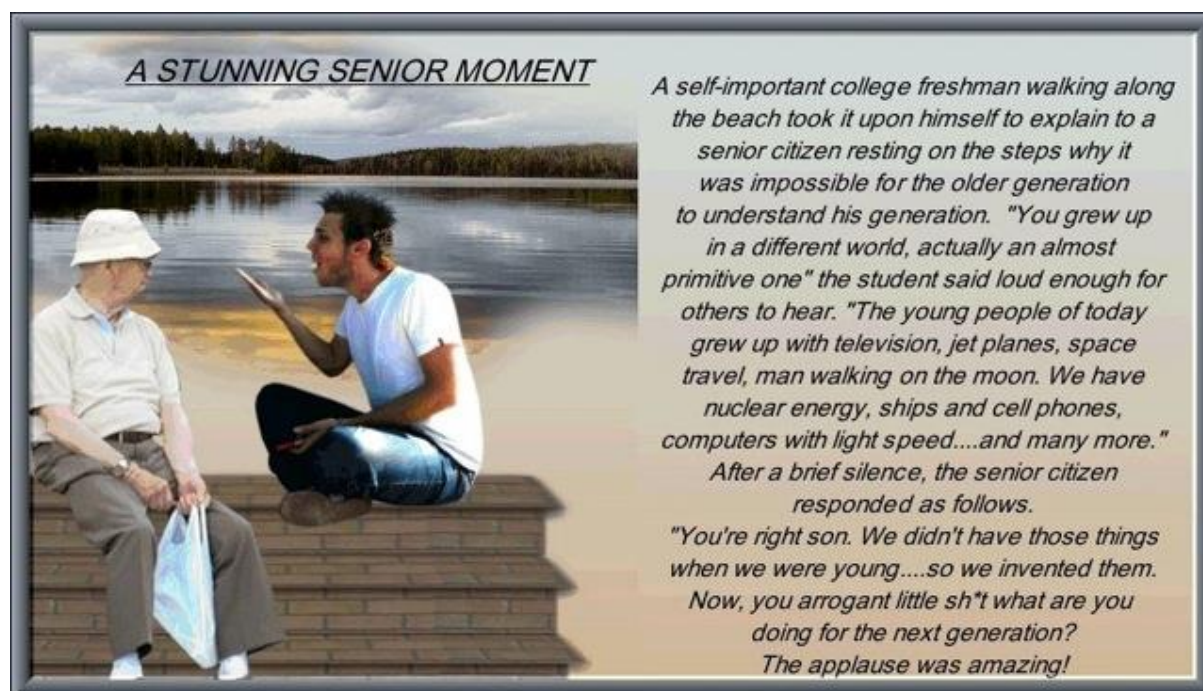
A golf ball story.
