Mystery Loop Run: February, 2021

After an unfortunate Covid related delay, this was our first run for the year. It was great to see so many members with over a dozen cars on this run. Starting from the usual Lakes location at the more relaxed time of 9.30, the group peeled out for a nice and easy drive to Yowie Park for our first stop where a few more members were waiting to join the run. Shortly it was time to head off after members fuelled up on morning tea, we headed toward D'Aguilar and on to Mount Mee Rd.

The road up to our destination was gentle and relaxing until we turned right onto Sellin Rd where it got to one of the more enjoyable windy and narrow roads before we arrived at our final destination of the Gantry.

It was great to make it back to The Gantry, last time we were here it had rained us out a bit, so this time we got to take in more sights and were able to read about the history of the old logging station that was once here.

Editors Note: Just a little bit of history about the Gantry

The Gantry was in fact an active sawmill producing timbers which were used in the Moreton Bay Region, including the Hornibrook Highway which connected Sandgate and Clontarf, a distance of 2,686 metres, making it Australia's longest bridge at the time.

When you drive around D'Aguilar National Park, you get a real appreciation for how difficult it would have been in the early days of sawmill operations. The only reminder of those industrial times is the skeleton of the huge shed, erected in the 1950's by Hancock's Sawmill to house the overhead gantry crane
