JANUARY RUN: Moore, 16/01/22

Moore is a rural QLD town with a population of around 300 people. Originally known as Stanley Gate, and then as Mooretown, in July 1910 the town took the name Moore from its railway station which closed in 1993.

Moore Provisional School opened in 1904, became Moore State School in 1908, and was closed in 2007. There are no schools left in Moore.

The Moore Post Office has been open since 1905. Moore features Stonehouse; a heritage listed former homestead and inn built from 1874 to 1888.
