5. I understand that it will be my sole responsibility to petition the court for reimbursement of any amounts spent by me to “preserve” property that is later redeemed. _____ (initial)
6. I understand that neither the court, nor the Clerk and Master, nor the tax attorney will provide assistance in petitioning the Court for expenses. _____ (initial)
7. I understand that upon the expiration of the redemption period, successful bidders will receive a “Clerk and Master’s Deed”, which is the legal equivalent of a quitclaim deed, which is without warranties. _____ (initial)
8. I understand that the amount listed **does not include any city taxes** and that this sale is subject to those taxes. Penalties and interest that accrue on these taxes during the redemption period will become the responsibility of the winning bidder in the event the property is not redeemed. _____ (initial)
