#### **CCB FOUNDATION, INC. AWARDED \$100,000 CUMPLINGS GRANT** Rockport nonprofit receives 4 years of funding from Cummings Foundation

[Rockport, Massachusetts, May 2022] – CCB Foundation, Inc is one of 140 local nonprofits to receive grants of \$100,000 to \$500,000 each through Cummings Foundation's \$25 Million Grant Program. The Rockport-based organization was chosen from a total of 580 applicants during a competitive review process. It will receive \$100,000 over four years.

CCB Foundation's mission is to support people in achieving and maintaining long-term recovery by funding, providing, and expanding the availability of transitional support services and programs. This funding will help to establish a peer-to-peer support and recovery program in Gloucester to serve the recovery community throughout Cape Ann.

The Cummings \$25 Million Grant Program supports Massachusetts nonprofits that are based in and primarily serve Middlesex, Essex, and Suffolk counties. This year's grant recipients represent a wide variety of causes, including food insecurity, immigrant and refugee services, social justice, education, and mental health services. The nonprofits are spread across 45 different cities and towns.
