The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Creator God,
In the beginning you formed the heavens and the earth. You filled the heavens with Sun, moon & stars for seasons, times and signs calling each star by name. You spoke forth abundant life & created us in your image, breathing into us the breath of life.

Compassionate God,
In your great love and in your vastness and omnipotence, you attend to our needs and hear the cries of our hearts. Through your Grace in Jesus, you have drawn us to you and made a way for us to be with you. When our love fails, Your love remains steadfast. You delivered us from captivity, and made covenant to be our sovereign God. Though there are

shadows and worries, you have placed Your Spirit in us to instruct with wisdom and comfort us in affliction; You have given your Word to be a lamp to our feet. You transform us with the glory of your love.

We praise you with all the creatures of the earth and all the company of heaven. We join their unending hymn:
**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest!
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!**

Redeeming God,
You sent us Jesus, who emptied himself that we might be filled, Who suffered and died that we might live. He fed the hungry, healed the afflicted, and ate with the scorned and forgotten of this world. He washed his disciples' feet and shared a holy meal as a feast of his ever-present love.

On the night he gave himself up for us, he ate at the table with those who would

dessert and deny him. He took bread,
broke it, and gave it to his disciples,
saying:

“Take, eat; this is my body which is
given for you.

Do this in remembrance of me.”
When the supper was over, he took the
cup, gave thanks to you, and gave it to
his disciples saying:

“Drink from this all of you; for this is my
blood of the new covenant,
poured out for you and for many for the
forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in
remembrance of me.”

Therefore, Holy God,
Grant that in praise and thanksgiving,
we may be a living sacrifice, holy and

acceptable in your sight, and that our
lives may proclaim the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died, Christ has risen,
Christ will come again.**

Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and
upon these gifts of bread and fruit of the
vine, that through Christ’s presence we
may become a beacon of your divine
light, a source of joy, a witness for
peace.

By your Spirit, make us one with Christ,
one with each other, and one in ministry
to all the world until we feast at the
heavenly banquet. Through your Son
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in your
holy Church, all honor and glory is
yours, almighty God, now and forever.

Amen.
