The Church's Financial Health

Discussion of this topic is a new idea. Although it makes one uncomfortable, we believe in openness. During COVID we did very well for a church that was shut down. Our costs dropped: electricity, oil, paper goods and wear and tear. Now joyously we have reopened and are able to provide a much needed space and services to many. As a result expenses have increased as more supplies are used, the lights are on more, and soon cooler temperatures will require heat in the building.

Because the heating season will soon be upon us, let's highlight fuel costs.

Oil Costs last winter:

\$21,906.58 although we had budgeted on \$15,000.00

the average cost per gallon was \$2.94

This year the heating oil costs are much higher; the average this year will be @ \$4.17/gallon resulting in a yearly expense of at least \$32.000.00

We at HUMC have much to be thankful for: our new pastor, the sound of laughter and song from the children in Here Wee Grow, the joy of those who use the church to enhance the quality of their lives, the opportunities for getting together in prayer and fellowship and the chance to work together to create a vision for the church moving forward. In order to continue and expand the good works, we need to be faithful in our giving.

And to that end we also need to start the Oil Fund. If you can find it in your heart to give an extra \$20 and note that it is for Fuel Cost we will hopefully have the extra to cover the budget.
