# Area 4 - Employee Shine




Mason Quiram

David Stahl, Board Member (Secretary) for the Henry County Conservation District. David's voice may seem a bit familiar. You may have heard it at the Kentucky State FFA Convention, a Church Revival, or KACD Convention entertainment.

David, is a jack of all trades; from the Piano Doctor, Chef, retired Ag Teacher, food aficionado, singer and entertainer.

David is a dedicated board member to the Henry County Conservation District and is always up to try new conservation practices throughout the county. David is a huge asset and we cannot thank him enough for everything he does!

# Area 6 – Superstar Supervisor



Don Sayre

Anderson County

Don serves as Anderson County's 2023 Master Conservationist and Kentucky's 2023 Cooperator of the Year. He has served on the Conservation District board since 2011. Because part of his 425-acre farm does not have access to electricity, Don has been very innovative regarding water distribution.

Don uses a solar panel that allows him to pump water from his pond to four 3,000-gallon plastic tanks. The water is then fed by gravity flow to four tire waterers on 6000' of line that run South off the storage tanks. The pop-up risers go North off the storage tanks for an additional 2300'. The tanks are stored under roof to prevent UV breakdown.

All conservation practices that Don has implemented on his farm help to reduce runoff into streams caused by livestock activities as well as prevent soil erosion due to cropping practices. These include efficient pasture utilization by means of rotational grazing of improved pastures made up of cool season grasses and legumes. In addition, Don utilizes a sacrifice lot for winter feeding to reduce pugging of pastures. To protect streambanks from erosion Don has built.

Practices he has installed include: Sacrifice lot for winter feeding to reduce pugging of pastures; Fences throughout the farm to exclude cattle from the stream and pond; Rock/gravel on Geotextile for four gate openings; Seven gates have Geotextile in place to prevent rutting; Four tire waterers and four Ritchie frost-free waterers are installed, most of which are served by a municipal water source


