"Putting God First: A Biblical Guide to Life's Priorities"

1. **Seek God First (Matthew 6:33)**

"Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

Begin each day focused on your relationship with God through prayer, reading the Word of God, and seeking His will. Let this guide every area of life.

2. **Love Others as Yourself (Matthew 22:39)**

Jesus teaches that the second greatest commandment is to *"love your neighbor as yourself."*

3. **Work Diligently and with Integrity (Colossians 3:23-24)**

4. **Cultivate Contentment and Stewardship (1 Timothy 6:6-10)**

"Godliness with contentment is great gain."

Rather than chasing material wealth or status, be grateful for what God has provided. Practice wise stewardship of your time, resources, and finances, knowing that all belongs to God.

5. **Balance Rest and Work (Exodus 20:8-10)**

"Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy."

God designed us to need rest. Make time for weekly rest and renewal, allowing space for spiritual and physical rejuvenation. And *Rest well!*

6. **Pursue Godly Wisdom (Proverbs 3:5-6)**

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart... He will make your paths straight."

Depend on God's wisdom through prayer and the Word of God to make decisions. Seek His guidance rather than relying solely on personal plans.

7. Focus on Eternity (Colossians 3:2)

"Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things."

Live with a perspective that values eternal things—faith, love, and service over temporary pleasures or accomplishments. Remember, our ultimate home is with God.

By prioritizing life according to these biblical principles, we align our goals with God's will, cultivating a life of purpose, peace, and fulfillment in Him.

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
