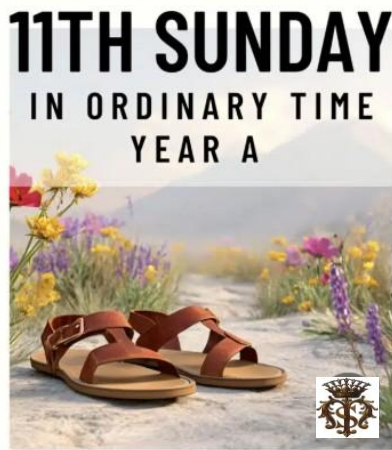

11TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YR. A 14TH JUNE 2026

Reflection

The readings for the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A, remind us of the profound relationship between God and His people, a relationship marked by love, mercy and a call to serve.

The 1st reading from the book of Exodus 19:2-6, we hear about God's covenant with the Israelites. He calls them to be His treasured possession, a kingdom of priests and a holy nation. This invitation is not just for the sake of privilege but for mission God desires that His people reflect His holiness and share His love with the world. This theme resonates deeply in our own lives, as we are also called into a relationship with God and sent forth to bear witness to His goodness.

The 2nd reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans 5:6-11, emphasizes that while we were still powerless, Christ died for us, demonstrating the depth of God's love. This a love that is proactive; it seeks us out in our weakness and offers redemption. This gift compels us not only to accept His love but to share it, embodying the very love we have received.

The gospel taken from Matthew 9:36, 10:8, we see Jesus moved by compassion as He looks upon the crowds, distressed and dejected. He then sends His disciples out, empowering them to heal, proclaim good news and serve those in need. Jesus' actions remind us that our faith is not merely a personal journey but a communal mission. We, too, are called to respond to the world's need with compassion and action.

Let us ask ourselves: How am I responding to God's call? Am I recognizing my role as a holy nation serving as instruments of peace and love in my communities?

Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

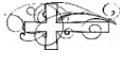

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

9:36-10:8

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

At that time: When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.'

And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every affliction. The names of the twelve Apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them, 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And proclaim as you go, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is at hand." Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without paying; give without pay.'
