

**14<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR C) 6<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2025**

*"The harvest is rich but the labourers are few..."*

*Jesus appoints a number of his disciples outside of the Twelve to go ahead of him to prepare the regions where he intends to go. These seventy-two disciples of Jesus represent him when he is absent, and they carry out what will be the work of the Church because the people that needs to be proclaimed of peace and the kingdom are enormous. So, Jesus asks them to pray to the Father to send labourers into the harvest.*

*The successful missionary work of Jesus and his disciples is depicted as a plentiful harvest. Although they sometimes experience rejections, there is still much positive response to the gospel. Yet there are not enough labourers to reap the harvest, so Jesus tells his disciples to ask God, "the Lord of the harvest", to call forth more men and women to serve with them so that the missionary task will grow. As people receive the gospel they will take responsibility for it and help deliver it to others.*



**Canonisation of Bl. Carlo Acutis** – Pope Leo XIV held the first Ordinary Public Consistory of his pontificate, with Cardinals giving their formal approval for the canonisations of eight Blessed. During the ceremony, the Holy Father announced that Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis will be canonized together on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2025.

At that time: The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him,

two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. And he said to them, ‘The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no money bag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, “Peace be to this house!” And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the labourer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. Heal the sick in it and say to them, “The kingdom of God has come near to you.” But whenever you enter at town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, “Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.” I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.’

The seventy-two returned with joy, saying, ‘Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!’ And he said to them, ‘I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.’
