4th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YR. A 1st FEB. 2026

Sunday Reflection

The readings for the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A, calls us to trust in God and to embrace the humility of life. In the Beatitudes, we discover that God's blessing belongs to the poor in spirit, the meek and those who rely entirely in Him.

In the 1st reading from the prophet Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13, we encounter a message of hope and restoration. The prophet calls us to seek the Lord, emphasizing that those who humble themselves and rely on God will find refuge and strength. In a world that often values power and privilege, prophet Zephaniah reminds us that God's favour rests on the meek and lowly.

The second reading is taken from the 1st letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 1:26-31. Paul reminds us that God choose the weak and foolish to shame the wise, illustrating that His ways are often contrary to the ways of the world. We are not defined by our status or achievements but by our identity as beloved children of God. It is in our humility and reliance on God that we discover true worth and purpose.

In the Gospel of St. Matthew 5:1-12, we hear the Beatitudes, the blueprint for Christian living. Jesus proclaims blessing upon the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek and the peacemakers. Each of these qualities reflects a heart open to God's grace and a life lived for others. They challenge us to rethink our values and priorities in light of God's kingdom.

As we ponder these readings, let us ask ourselves: How can I embody the humility and compassion that Jesus champion? In a world that often glorifies those who are powerful and wealthy, how can I uplift the poor and marginalized and serve those in need?
