Sunday Reflection

The Gospel of this Sunday is taken from the gospel of John 3:14-21. It is where the well-known phrase that says: "For this is how God loved the world: he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believe in him may not perish but may have eternal life." The expression "God loved the world", is not just bringing justice and peace to our troubled world but most of all it brings salvation, healing and new life.

Before that happens, the Son of man must be lifted up first, just like when Moses made the brazen serpent and put it on a standard, the people who had been bitten by the fiery serpent looked at it and were healed (Num. 21:4-9). However, when the gospel of John use of the imagery is not the serpent but the lifting up. As in the Old Jewish interpretation the uplifted serpent drew the hearts of Israel to God for their salvation, so the uplifted Jesus drew people to himself and so gathered to God those who were his children.

When Jesus dies on the cross "they look on the one they have pierced" (Jn. 19:37). Looking on, they see the Saviour, the source of salvation for all as he draws all to himself and seeing the Son, to see the Father. His death reveals the complete gift of the Father who "gave" his only Son because he loved the world so much.
