Sunday Reflection

Today we begin the Holy Week with the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. He entered riding on a colt, (Mk11:1-7), the evangelist Mark calls attention to the relationship between Jesus and the words of prophet Zechariah (9:9) that the future king will enter Jerusalem on "the foal of an ass". The choice of a donkey not only suggests the humility but peacemaker too.

While Jesus was entering Jerusalem on a donkey the people spread "leafy branches" and crying out "Hosanna", reminds the Israelites of Simon Maccabeus enters Jerusalem "with praises and palm branches" to take back the Temple.

The prophecy of Zechariah and the cleansing of the Temple by Simon Maccabeus converge on Jesus' coming into Jerusalem, to restore the Temple to its original state as a place of worship.

The said events above bring us to the core of the Passion narrative of the Gospel of Mark, which is: the identity of Jesus as Son of God and the New Temple. It was the centurion's confession that the identity of Jesus was revealed: "In truth this man was Son of God". In the meantime, at the moment of His last breath, the tearing of the veil of the holy of holies, shows that the ancient Temple loses its sacred character. This function is filled thereafter by another sign, which is the very body of Jesus.
