Reflection

The Gospel of this Trinity Sunday is taken from John 16:12-15. Emerging from these difficult to understand sentences is the radically trinitarian theology of the evangelist John – a sense of distinct divine persons held within an overall unity of being and operation. This Father expresses a life-giving Word to the world, a Word which the Son embodies and makes known in his human flesh, the Spirit, sent from Father and Son, continuous the revelation of that Word to the community and the world in the post-Easter situation.

Jesus reveals the mystery of the Trinity to us, not just to let us know the truth about God, but also to know the truth about ourselves as to what is our origin, where is our destiny and how we can arrive at that final point. We only exist, and the world only exists, because God give life. He is the Father who looks upon us so his children and is closer to us than we are to ourselves. Everyday is a day to love the Father, Son and Holy Spirit so we should strive to make the Holy Trinity a more practical part on our lives. Love is the binding force of the three persons of the Trinity; so, when we love we share in that community of love which is the living God.

All: Thanks be to God.

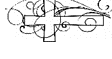

NICENE CREED—See Laudate 479 (205)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.
