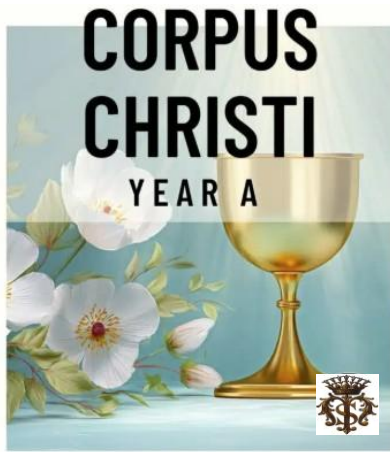

CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY YR. A 7TH JUNE 2026

Reflection

The readings for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Year A, invite us to reflect on the profound mystery and gift of the Eucharist, which nourishes our souls and strengthens our faith.

The 1st reading from the book of Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16, we are reminded of how God nourished His people in the wilderness, providing manna from heaven to sustain them. This physical sustenance was not merely for survival; it was a sign of God's deeper desire to be in relationship with His people.

The 2nd reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 10:16-17, spell out the Eucharistic mystery. "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" Here, we see the intimate connection among believers, and with Christ himself. When we partake in the Eucharist, we are not just fed; we enter into a profound relationship with the Lord and with one another.

The Gospel is taken from John 6:51-58, Jesus declares, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." This promise offers us eternal life a life filled with hope, a life that transcends our earthly struggles. It invites us to deepen our faith and trust in Him, acknowledging that in consuming the bread of life, we become part of His very being.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel

according to John

6:51-58

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

At that time: Jesus said to the Jews, 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live for ever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.' The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?'

So Jesus said to them, 'Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever feeds on me, he also will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like the bread the fathers ate, and died. Whoever feeds on this bread will live for ever.'

NICENE CREED—See Laudate 479 (205)

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.
