Reflection

The Gospel of this 18th Sunday Ordinary Time Year C is taken from Luke 12:13-21. There is nothing odd in the man's question because Judaism didn't distinguish between civil and religious codes of law. In this case, however, the man is not just asking for an impartial arbitration, he is ordering the judge to follow his own ruling; he is trying to use Jesus.

I suppose we can tentatively reconstruct the background for the man's request. A father/parent dies and leaves the inheritance as a unit to his children. Normally the children should live together and enjoy the inheritance in harmony. But here the man wants a division of the inheritance (probably a property) according to his right; the brotherly or family relationship is obviously broken, and the man wants the break to be finalized by total separation. To this, Jesus objects that He is not a "divider" and thus indirectly suggests that he is a reconciler instead. He invites the petitioner to gain a new insight of himself and refers to the danger of greed; the petitioner won't have his problem solved by a legal ruling, if his heart remains full of cupidity.

Just as a rich person, who was foolishly making great plans for a life of leisure and pleasure without any reference to God, was caught unprepared by sudden death, so also, a person may be wealthy, but his/her possession won't guarantee him/her life. This gospel also calls us to be an instrument of unity rather than division.



1. **Canonisation of Bl. Carlo Acutis** – Pope Leo XIV announced that Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis will be canonized together on 7th September 2025.

Though Saturday and Sunday masses will be as usual; Saturday at 10:00 am and Vigil at 6:30pm, Sundays at 9:30 am, 11:00 am, 12:30 am (Spanish Mass) and 6:30 pm.
4. **Thanksgiving Mass** – for the Canonisation of St. Carlo Acutis will be celebrated on 13th September 2025 (Saturday) at 3:00 pm with His Eminence Cardinal Vincent Nichols.
5. **Patronal Feast of Our Lady of Dolours / 150th Anniversary Mass** – Everyone is invited to join in our International Mass on the Feast of Our Lady of Dolours on 14th September 2024 at 11:00 am which is the celebration of the parish 150th Anniversary. After the Mass, we invite everyone to join us at the School Ground for a cultural food fair, feasting and program. Parishioners are encouraged to bring traditional dishes from their home countries and wear Traditional Attire too.



of the world to come. Amen.



GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to
Luke
12:13-21

All: Glory to you, O Lord.
At that time: Someone in the crowd said to
Jesus, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the
inheritance with me.' But he said to him,
'Man, who made me a judge or arbitrator
over you?' And he said to them, 'Take care,
and be on your guard against all
covetousness, for one's life does not consist

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the **Colossians**

3:1-5, 9-11

Brothers and Sisters: If you have been raised
with Christ, seek the things that are above,
where Christ is, seated at the right hand of
God. Set your minds on things that are
above, not on things that are on earth. For
you have died, and your life is hidden with
Christ in God. When Christ who is your life
appears, then you also will appear with him
in glory. Put to death, therefore, what is
earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity,
passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which
is idolatry. Do not lie to one another, seeing
that you have put off the old self with its
practices and have put on the new self,
which is being renewed in knowledge after
the image of its creator. Here there is not
Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircum-
cised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but
Christ is all, and in all.
