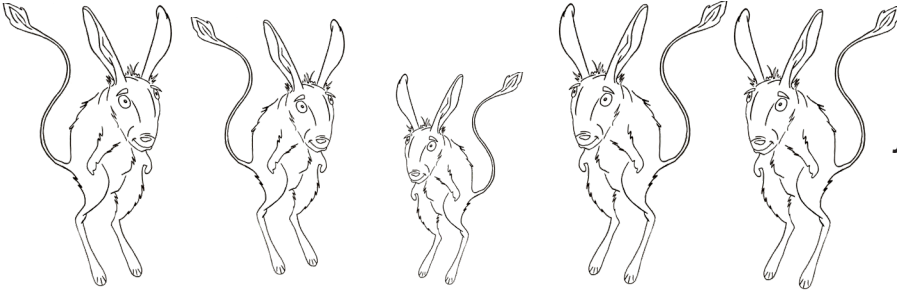
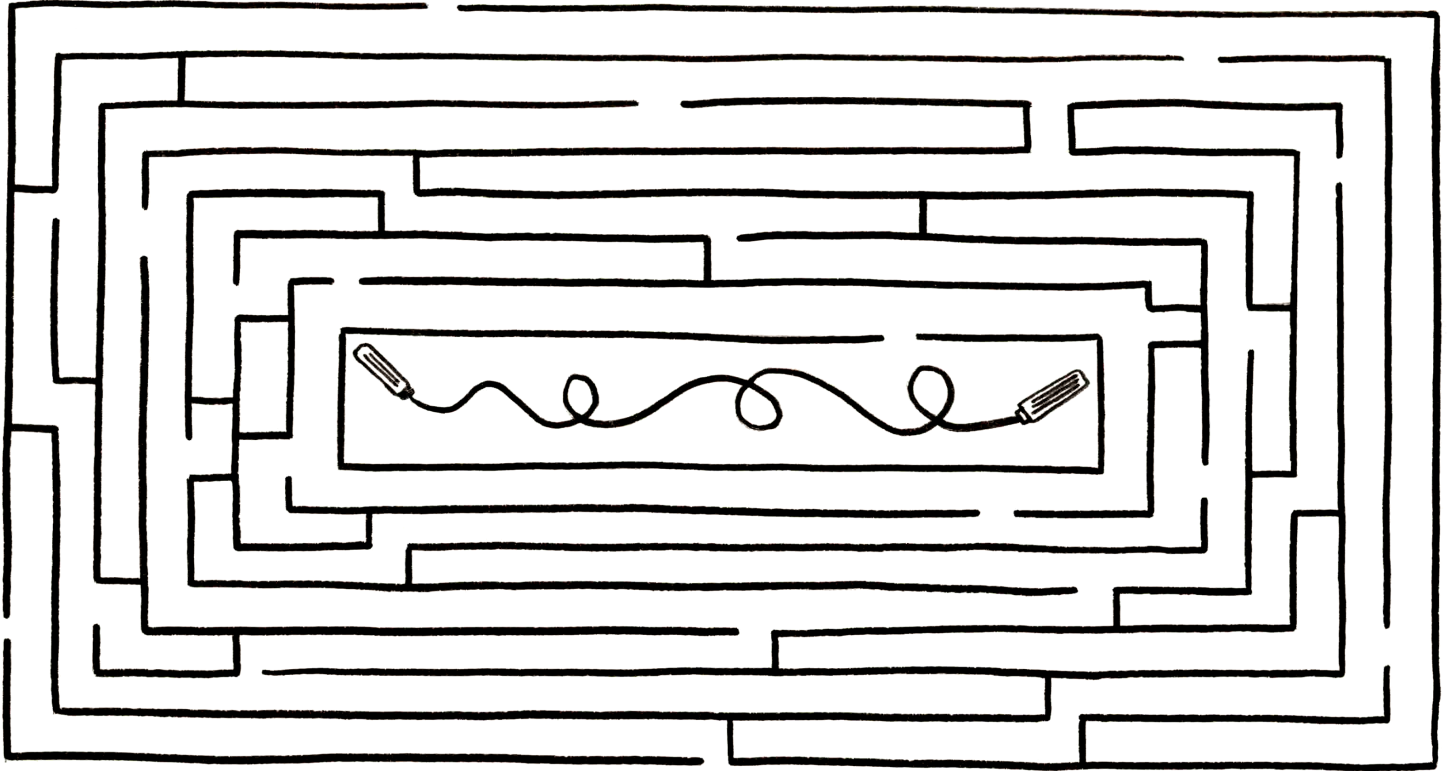




# What If...Jerboas Were Jump Ropers?

## Did You Know?

Long-eared jerboas have ears that are two-thirds as long as their bodies. This gives them the distinction of having the largest ears compared to their body size amongst all animals. Some jerboas can leap up to three feet vertically, an impressive feat for animals and humans alike.

Founded in 1973, the International Jump Rope Union (IJRU) is the international governing body for the competitive sport of jump rope / rope skipping. Athletes from 30 countries around the globe annually compete in the World Jump Rope Championship.
