Global FAST® Ultrasound Scanning Session - AFAST®, TFAST® and Vet BLUE® Lung

This hands-on scanning session covers image acquisition of AFAST®, TFAST® and Vet BLUE® combined as a single ultrasound exam called Global FAST®. The attendee will gain experience in imaging the abdomen (AFAST®), and thorax including echocardiography (TFAST®) and lung (Vet BLUE®). You must also attend the associated lectures on Friday, after the scanning session. An image acquisition LINK will be provided to registered attendees to watch a week prior to the scanning session. **18 people, \$645, 4 CEU.**



When Every Second Counts!

Thursday, Sept. 26, 2 sessions

9:00am-noon, 1:00-4:00pm

Every veterinarian and technician must be trained to recognize and respond to cardiopulmonary arrest. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is an essential skill that must be taught – and re-taught – throughout our careers. The goal of this workshop is to focus the published recommendations into concise and relevant recommendations for CPR in general practice. Doctors and technicians will learn compression techniques, the reasons for using certain drugs during CPR, and what to expect after CPR. Additionally, attendees will learn the value of having a prestocked crash cart or station in

their practice. Both lecture and hands-on practice times will be utilized throughout this session. CPR mannequins will be used for instruction and practice of compression techniques, intubation, and how to work as a team in simulated scenarios. **20 people, \$125, 3 CEU.**

Common Techniques in Soft Tissue Surgery: Canine and Feline

Ray Kudej, DVM, PhD, DACVS

Thursday, Sept. 26, 8:00am-noon (Canine) and 1:00-5:00pm (Feline)

Each course will provide participants the knowledge, skills and experience to confidently perform numerous common surgical procedures. Emphasis will be placed on the technical aspects used to perform each procedure and maximizing hands-on time in the workshop. The courses will be similar to resident training, with the procedures demonstrated and discussed by the instructor, followed by hands-on training to individually tailor learning and surgical proficiency for each participant.

Procedures for the canine workshop include forelimb amputation, hindlimb amputation, laryngeal tie-back, anal saccullectomy, and incisional gastropexy.

Procedures for the feline workshop include perineal urethrostomy using a dorsal recumbency approach, forelimb amputation, hindlimb amputation, E-tube placement, chest drain placement.

Basic IV Catheter Lab

Mylissa Fitzpatrick, LVT, CVPP, VTS (ECC) and Ciera Earl, LVT, VTS (ECC)

Thursday, Sept. 26, 9:00am-noon

Using animal models, this lab will give participants hands-on experience and confidence in placing IV catheters.

Attendees will learn about proper site preparation, appropriate size selection, taping techniques, and monitoring. Attendees will be able to monitor for signs of infection and apply a supportive bandage. Additional discussion of alternative and uncommon placement for IVC's will also be discussed.

Attendees best suited for this lab include:

- Veterinary technician students who want no-pressure experience to support their IV catheter skills.
- Veterinary Technicians/Nurses already working who want coaching and support for their IV catheter preparation, placement, and securing skills.

Advanced IV Catheter Lab

Mylissa Fitzpatrick, LVT, CVPP, VTS (ECC) and Ciera Earl, LVT, VTS (ECC)

Thursday, Sept. 26, 1:00-5:00pm

Advanced IV catheterization is a crucial procedure in clinical settings, providing access for the administration of medications, fluids, parenteral nutrition, and for monitoring central venous pressure. In this lab, attendees will learn about Central lines and peripherally inserted central lines (PICC). Indications for the placement, potential complications, and appropriate securing techniques will be discussed. Attendees will be able to navigate a central line kit and practice proper placement on an animal model using two different techniques. Additionally, attendees will be able to learn of two techniques for placement of PICC line sampling catheters, appropriate securing techniques, and bandaging.

The target audience for this lab includes:

- Veterinarians and veterinary technicians looking to elevate their skills
- Veterinary students looking for practical, hands-on experience with IV catheter placement.
- Specialty Practitioners in fields such as emergency and critical care or surgery, where advanced IV catheterization techniques are frequently required.
- Veterinary instructors and professors who wish to ensure they are up-to-date with advanced techniques to pass on to their students.

Basic Abdominal Ultrasound

Sunday, Sept. 29, 8:00am-4:30pm

In the morning, a lecture will introduce the basics of abdominal ultrasound by focusing on important anatomy, common pathological findings, and differential diagnoses. Although focusing on the major organs, all abdominal systems will be discussed with tips on obtaining all the images for a complete abdominal scan. Multiple case examples and videos will be utilized to showcase various anatomy and pathology. In the afternoon, under the supervision of experienced instructors, attendees will be guided through the abdomen to find the main anatomical landmarks and structures discussed in the morning session. By rotating through multiple patients, the students will experience a wide variety of anatomy to walk away from the lab with a solid understanding of the basic ultrasound exam.
