Workshops, Labs and Fun Events

Basic Abdominal Ultrasound Lab

Steven Tsai, DVM, DACVR



Thursday, Sept. 25, 8:00am-4:00pm

The morning lecture session will introduce the basics of abdominal ultrasound, focusing on important anatomy, common pathological findings, and differential diagnoses. Although focusing on the major organs, all abdominal systems will be discussed with tips on obtaining all the images for a complete abdominal scan. The afternoon session will have a demonstration scan by the instructor viewed by all participants and then hands-on training to find the main anatomical landmarks and important structures discussed in the morning session. The student will be guided through the abdomen, rotating through multiple patients and coached directly by the instructors. Students will experience a wide variety of anatomy and teachers to gain an understanding of the basic ultrasound exam. **20 people, \$695, 7 CEU.**

Common Techniques in Soft Tissue Surgery: Feline and Canine

Thursday, Sept. 25, 8:00am-noon (Feline) and 1:00-5:00pm (Canine)

Each 4-hour course is designed to provide participants with knowledge, skills and experience to confidently perform numerous common surgical procedures. Emphasis will be placed on the technical aspects used to perform each procedure and maximizing hands-on time in the workshop.

The courses will be taught similar to resident training. For the first hour, following a brief introduction, a board-certified surgeon with extensive experience will perform each surgical procedure on a cadaver and simultaneously discuss important considerations/ common errors. Then "hands-on" training will be supervised to individually tailor learning and surgical proficiency for each participant.

Feline Session: Procedures include forelimb amputation, hindlimb amputation, perineal urethrostomy using a dorsal recumbency approach, total ear canal ablation - bulla osteotomy (TECA-BO), tail and digit amputation. **12 people, \$695, 4 CEU, DVM only.**

Canine Session: Procedures include forelimb amputation, hindlimb amputation, laryngeal tie-back, and incisional gastropexy, tail and digit amputation. **12 people, \$695, 4 CEU, DVM only.**

Extracapsular CrCL and MPL Workshop

Don Hulse, DVM, DACVS, DECVS

Thursday, Sept. 25, 8:00am-4:00pm

Dogs (typically small breeds) will often present with acute onset lameness secondary to complete cranial cruciate ligament rupture. Upon physical exam, the stifle is very unstable, and a Grade 2-3 patella luxation is often present as well. The patella luxation is aggravated by the presence of excess internal rotational instability due to the CrCL injury. To return the patient to normal function, the CrCL injury must be addressed (stabilized) as well as the patella luxation. The technique described in this laboratory allows the attending surgeon to stabilize the craniocaudal laxity with an isometric extracapsular procedure that allows stabilization of the patella luxation using standard technique.

Strengthening for Dogs with Stifle Disease

Stifle disease is very common in many types of dogs. Whether the disease is treated surgically or non-surgically, strengthening, and appropriate range of motion is essential for movement, health, and a multimodal approach. This laboratory session will meet the following goals: Briefly understand stifle disease and the ramifications on the musculoskeletal system; Understand the importance of the stifle stabilizers in supporting the stifle; Understand the importance of additional stabilizers in the body, supporting the hindlimb; Understand static and dynamic exercises for stifle disease; Decide and prescribe appropriate exercises and activities for stifle disease. **25 people, \$275, 3 CEU.**

Basic+ Soft Tissue Ultrasound Lab

Sunday, Sept. 28, 8:00am-5:00pm

This ultrasound workshop offers a practical review of foundational scanning methodology, including probe orientation, image optimization, and anatomical landmarks. Participants will apply these techniques while scanning the liver, gallbladder, spleen, kidneys, and urinary bladder, focusing on organ identification and common pathology recognition.



Special emphasis will be placed on detailed evaluation of the biliary system, pancreas, adrenal glands, and gastrointestinal tract. Scanning protocols and tips for optimizing visualization of these more challenging structures will be demonstrated and practiced. Participants will gain confidence in recognizing sonographic appearances of normal versus abnormal findings, with guidance provided by experienced instructors throughout the session. **18 people, \$795, 8 CEU.**
