


## What is on my election ballot?

Proposition No. 1 – Safety, Security, and Technology Improvements

**Capital & Technology Levy** 



- 2023-24 school year **budget** is approx. \$27 million (state, federal and local funds)
- Cap/Tech Levy is 7% or approx. \$1.95 million

#### A capital projects levy provides funds for:

- Upgrading fire safety systems and play structures at Chautauqua Elementary School
- Upgrading entry controls, door locks, security cameras and other security systems
- Upgrading and/or improving heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems and equipment ("HVAC")













#### A capital projects levy provides funds for:

- Acquiring, installing and implementing instructional technology equipment, infrastructure and systems.
- Support staffing
- Maintenance and support for student and staff devices








### If Voters Approve Proposition No. 1


- Provide essential safety and security infrastructure that are required by state law
- Increase stability in operations so the district can address challenges with decreasing enrollment, facility needs and inadequate state funding
- Maintain the devices distributed to students and staff during the pandemic with a refresh cycle to keep devices updated
- Strengthen personalized learning through technology
- Enhance technology infrastructure (wifi, network equipment, etc.)
- On track to meet the school board policy that requires 5-6.5% of fund balance (savings)

### If Voters Do Not Approve Proposition No. 1

- Potential cuts to
  - Staff and academic programs
  - Administration and support staff
  - Athletics and activities programming
- Device and technology costs would come from the general fund
- Technology support and device maintenance for families and staff would be limited
- Device upgrade cycles would be delayed





#### Tax Impact

The proposed four-year replacement Capital Levy would authorize collection of taxes to provide **\$1,950,000 each year** from 2025 through and including 2028.

If approved by voters, the replacement levy would be an additional \$0.10 per \$1,000 assessed value compared to the prior collection year. Due to the existing need, this equates to **approximately \$5.83 more per month** for the owner of a \$700,000 home.


