## CHARTER OF

## THE COLLEGE SETTLEMENT OF PHILADELPHIA.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas No. 2 of Philadelphia County:-

In compliance with the requirements of an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania entitled "An Act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations" approved the 29th day of April, 1874, and the supplements thereto, the undersigned, all of whom are citizens of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together for the purpose hereinafter specified and desiring that they may be incorporated according to law do hereby certify:

- First. That the name of the proposed corporation is "The College Settlement of Philadelphia".
- Second. The purpose for which said corporation is formed shall be the maintaining of a College Settlement in Philadelphia, for the social improvement of the neighborhood wherein the same is or may be located.
- Third. The business of said corporation is to be transacted in the City of Philadelphia.
- Fourth. Said corporation is to exist perpetually.
  - Fifth. Said corporation will have no capital stock.
- Sixth. Said corporation will be governed by an Executive Committee, the number of members of which shall be fixed and determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the corporation, in conjunction with the Officers of the corporation.
- Seventh. The Officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected at the times and for the terms specified in the Constitution and By-Laws.
