

Smoking Fentanyl?

A new trend emerges

In a 2024 release the CDC reported more people are dying from smoking drugs than injecting them. Illicit fentanyl accounted for the vast majority of these deaths.

The Northeast US, including Pennsylvania, saw the highest increase of smoking deaths (91%).

Who is most at risk?

Stimulant Users who are opioid naive and Black Americans have accounted for the fastest growing demographic for illicit fentanyl overdoses since 2020.

So What Can Be Done To Minimize These Risks?

Researchers in Philadelphia have documented numerous non-fatal fentanyl overdoses that occurred after an opioid naive individual used another person's crack stem that contained residue from prior fentanyl use.

What Next?

If your program doesn't distribute pipes at this time, it should consider adding them. If your program already has pipes it's important to make your participants aware of this trend. Keeping a single pipe for fentanyl use reduces the risk of dosing the next user.



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
