New image size for images this year!

CACCA is moving to the 1920 pixels by 1080 pixels to be consistent with the Photographic Society of America. You will need to use this new size when entering your images in 411 competition software.

To set up an image to be 1920 pixels wide by 1080 pixels high in Photoshop, you can do the following:

- 1. Select Image > Image Size
- 2. In a landscape image the largest value can be 1920 in the Width field and 1080 or smaller in the Height field.
- 3. In a portrait image, the largest value can be 1080 in the Height field and smaller than 1080 in the Width field.
- 4. Set the resolution to 300 dpi (not a necessary set for the competition software)
- 5. To maintain the aspect ratio of the image, you can check the Constrain Proportions box.

6. Click OK

You can also use the keyboard shortcut Ctrl+Alt+I on Windows or Command+Option+I on Mac to open the Image Size dialog box.

Remember the maximum size for a wide image is 1920 pixels. When the width is 1920 pixels, the maximum height can be 1080 pixels (it can be less than this but no larger than 1080).

If your image is taller than it is wide, the maximum height can only be 1080 pixels. The width will be less than 1080 pixels.
