4-H & OPEN YOUTH BEEF CARCASS REGULATIONS 2020

- 1. One entry per exhibitor. 4-H entries must be tagged as a 4-H project and market record book kept. CCIA tags will be used for 4-H tag. Open Youth projects must also be tagged and registered under a CCIA tag. A BC Ag Expo ear tag will be sent to you prior to animal drop off date. Entries are restricted to clubs / youth that have previously attended BC Ag Expo.
- 2. Animals entered in this class shall not be more than 22 months of age.
- 3. All entries must be delivered to RAINER CUSTOM CUTTING in DARFIELD BC. September 13, 2020 from 10 AM – 2PM. This will allow for a proper slaughter and hanging time of the carcass for a fair evaluation.
 - (WEIGHING Facilities unavailable at Rainer's therefore 4-H entries must organize their own weighing to get live weight for their record book).
- 4. Open Youth entries do not have to be halter broken; 4-H entries are subject to 4-H club's project halter breaking club policy.
- 5. All entries shown in this class are to be slaughtered as arranged for by the BC Ag Expo and carcasses scored by an officer of the carcass committee according to current standards for quality grade, yield grade, and carcass weight requirements.
- 6. Only dehorned cattle will be eligible.
- 7. Entry deadline August 15, 2020. Fees must accompany entries. All carcass entries are subject to the General Rules & Regulations of the BC Ag Expo.
- 8. A mandatory side profile photo of the live carcass steer with the exhibitor, late in the feeding period, is required to be submitted by September 8th at https://bcagexpo.fairwire.com/. This photo will be used for virtual show purposes and the on-line auction.

Carcass Sale rules

- 1. Carcasses sold through the on-sale at a 3% commission to British Columbia Agricultural Exposition Society.
- 2. Carcasses will be sold on the basis of price per lb of carcass weight. Carcasses will be sold by the side.
- 3. Carcass animals will be sold throughout the sale in order of placing.
- 4. The BC Agricultural Exposition Society Carcass Committee has the right to withhold a B grade or a dark cutter carcass from the Sale.
