

## **STALL COMPETITION GUIDELINES** **BEEF, LAMB, HORSE, RABBIT, GOAT, CAVY**

Stall cards can be of a unique construction but must be hung sturdily.

1. No streamers or any other waving obstacles, such as balloons, may be used which may frighten or distract the animals.
2. No flammable substance may be used.
3. Any excessive decorations will not be considered in the stall competition. They will be for general appearance of the 4-H Club to the general public.
4. Any decoration should not interfere with the sight of any other clubs or with the sight of any animals within the club itself.
5. No decorations shall exceed 8" in height and/or beyond the allotted stall premises of a club (including sign).
6. Greenery will be permitted on a manageable basis.
7. The committee reserves the right to manage any excessive decorations.
8. The committee will charge \$100.00 to any club leaving an excess of debris and/or garbage.
9. Bad conduct of any member during the BC Agricultural Expo can result in loss of this competition.
10. The stall competition will start at 8 AM on the FRIDAY of BC Ag Expo and will continue on a 24-hour basis through to 2 p.m. on the SUNDAY of BC Ag Expo.
11. *Stalls to be judged by a Club Leader/Parent twice a day (Am & Pm) and these points will be averaged for the Club's daily score, don't judge your Club: send to the office by 2pm on Sunday.*
12. *Judges, please use attached stall competition score card for distribution of points awarded.*

### **SCORING CRITERIA**

#### **IDENTIFICATION**

- Club & Project signs displayed
- Safety signs
- Originality in design

#### **MEMBERS**

- Neat & clean appearance
- Courteous to the public
- Able to answer questions

#### **STALLS**

- Neat and tidy at all times
- Adequate, clean bedding
- Clean water available
- Feed pans removed after feeding
- Projects clean and stalled safely

#### **EQUIPMENT**

- Equipment safely operated
- Tack boxes clean and tidy
- Equipment put away
- Supplies & garbage stored
- First Aid kit
