ike so many other things, 2024 brought changes to the LRC Trap matches. It was decided that in lieu of a single the relay is given a point. The match winner, we would break the shooter that has the most points shooting season into quarters and recognize a shooter in each quarter. In addition, each quarter would highlight a different shooting competition. We did this to hopefully reach out to more shooters that could not commit to an entire year of competition and to offer different ways to win recognition.

The first quarter was a simple 12gauge shotgun competition, with the shooter with the highest average winning. This quarter we recognized Mike Davis. The second quarter was a competition we call the Blind Boogey, during which

random numbers (1-25) are drawn and the shooter breaking targets with corresponding numbers in during this competition wins. The lucky winner for this quarter was **Rich Venegas** (but he had to work very hard to beat Bill Harvey). The third quarter had shooters using their sub-gauge shotguns (gauges .410 cal, .22 cal., and .28 cal.). The last quarter was a return to the Blind Boogey competition and Ray Ramsey accumulated the most points, but also shot more trap than the rest of us combined. He was determined to win!!!
