## 2026 BUSINESS MEETING

**O**n April 2nd we held the 2026 Annual Business Meeting. This year we tried something new by hosting a swap meet before the meeting. We tend to expect a few growing pains here and there whenever we expand club activities, so we were pleasantly surprised at how well it went! The turn out for the swap meet was great, it brought out a few new faces and gave us a chance to catch up with all the club regulars too.

2025 was a big year of changes for the club. The 2025 financial year for the LRCF wrapped up on December 31<sup>st</sup> with a total profit of just over \$55,000.00. Our most notable detail in 2025 was the price increase across nearly all of our vendors and utilities, but the LRCF was able to stay ahead thanks to the major increase in customers shooting on the range. In 2025 alone we added 115 new members to the club as well as hired four new range safety officers to help manage the higher volume of shooters. We were also able to begin several major projects for the outdoor range that fall

under our long-range planning committee, these projects include increasing our electrical power, beginning the process of adding a well for potable water, and potentially increasing the perimeter of the range to add a “green wall” in the future. Throughout the rest of 2026 we’re looking to finish our electrical upgrades, complete the well and place new signs for the entrance. Already 2026 is shaping up to be a very big year for the club both financially and historically as we prepare to celebrate our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary in June. The Lincoln Rifle Club is currently waiting for PG&E to complete the project plans for the Dillman Range. Once a date has been set the range will be temporarily closed so that PG&E can shut off power to the nearest pole and upgrade our 100amp panel for 200amp. This will allow us to extend electricity further out on Ormsby as well as hopefully fix our current issue of shorting lights.

Along with improving the electrical at

the outdoor range we are also looking at the potential for a well. Currently we have our permit and are in the initial stages of testing to see where on the range is a good location as well as deciding how far into the project the club is willing to go in 2026.

Finally, the newest improvement on the Dillman Range is our newly repaired Soda Vending Machine. Shooters on the Dillman Range will once again be able to enjoy an ice-cold beverage while shooting in the heat. Sodas will only cost \$1.00.

The Lincoln Rifle Club will be putting in an order for new merchandise with our new logo and name on it. These items will be available before the start of our twice annual half-off sale. The sales will take place in the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of June and December. This is the best opportunity for both members and the public to purchase range passes for only \$10.00.

Elections ran smoothly this year thanks in part to the great turnout, with well over our needed quorum in attendance, and those who volunteered to count the ballots, set up,

and clean up the meeting.

Congratulations to the new members of the Board of Directors and Range Committee! **Leonard Zick, Robert Lusk, and Chuck Riglick** were reelected to the BOD, with new additions **Tamara Dumont and Matt Costello** joining the board. **Dan Burghardt and Leo Rosko Jr.** were reelected to the Range Committee alongside **Eric Behr**, who is a regular attendee of the RC meetings.

Thank you for joining us this year, we look forward to seeing you all again next year!

We have had some new shooters come by and hopefully the sport will continue to grow.



CHUCK RIGLICK *CMP MATCH DIRECTOR*

A sincere Thank You for all the club members who attended the Annual Voting Membership meeting on 2 April. Thank you for your votes in allowing me the honor of serving the LRC Foundation as a member of the Board of Directors more two more years.

Our March match was held on the 21st (third Saturday) and we welcomed two new shooters who have never shot at Dillman Range before. This was a father/daughter team, the second woman who has completed in our CMP match at Dillman. Ashlyn Waldron was using a stock AR-15 platform with iron sights in the modern military category. Her scores were very respectable for her first match. Her father, Brad, also using a stock AR shot a 249-2X. Both enjoyed a fun filled shooting event together.

Cary Triplet put his new toy to use during this match. It is an electronically scored target, the kind now used at the big CMP regional games in Phoenix, AZ and Camp Butler, NC etc. It has sensors located on the frame outside of the target face. These sensors triangulate each shot and show it on an electronic screen or a smart phone. This system eliminates the need for target pullers who are located in the 200 yard pits. Cary, can now compete in both CMP and NRA High Power matches. Both matches

are run on the third Saturday of each month.

Our April match was held on the 18th, and with great weather, had a good turnout. The first relay had two high scorers using as-issue M-1's. James Carson shot a 253-1X and Jaime Bagtas shot a 247-3X these did not qualify for an award pin. Dave Crippen shot a 254-3X in the Unlimited Modern Military category which didn't medal in that difficult category.

Then there was the second relay where all the pins were earned. Cary Triplet, shooting at 200yards and using an as-issued M-1 Garand (the Beast) shot a 279-7X earning a Gold Garand award pin!! It was a long time since I awarded out a gold pin in this category. Then there was James Carson in the M-1 Carbine match (40 shots for record) shot a 324-1X earning a bronze carbine pin. James is another example of someone who can really shoot the little, light weapon really well. Jaime Bagtas shot a 283-6X using a scoped AR platform in that really tough to get an award, Unlimited modern military category. That score did earn him a bronze award pin.

Our May match will be on the 16th, I will be out of town, attending a nephew's college graduation. Cary Triplet has graciously taken the helm in officiating for this match.



Before the Civilian Marksmanship Program became a "quasi government" privately run organization, it started out as a government organization, began during Theodore Roosevelt's administration. It was called the Board for the Promotion of Rifle Practice and later under The Director of Civilian Marksmanship (DCM). This was under The Department of The Army and was directed by usually a full "bird" colonel in the U.S. Army. Those of us "old timers" who hoard ancient issues of The American Rifleman magazine, can see articles in the 1980's and maybe very early 90's which refer to being able to purchase M-1 Garands from the DCM for unbelievably low prices. I got one of my M-1's from the DCM for \$135.00 in 1979. You did have to show that you were a competitive shooter and had to go through a full FBI check, be fingerprinted etc. But, they delivered the rifle to your front door.

Then in about the mid-90's politicians decided that the DCM was an unneeded and wasteful expense. Rather than let this wonderful organization go down as just memory, a group of shooters and individuals with exceptional common sense decided to form a private organization under sanction by the government, but supported by private funds, sanctioned matches, and sales of equipment which was military surplus. They formed the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP), which many people feel is an awesome substitute for the once government program which really did some good.

With that, I was going through my old treasured printed stuff (magazines) and found a yellowed October 15, 1986 California Rifle and Pistol Association newspaper The Firing Line. It had a full page article on page 23 entitled 1930 DCM Price

List- Read it and Weep! So now, we can go down memory lane and see some good things the government did for shooters in the 1930's:

- The DCM offered a Civilian version of the 1903 Springfield as a target model with adjustable Lyman sights- \$85.00
- The same rifle with a Winchester target telescopic sight - \$112.99
- M1903 Service Rifle - \$32.75 and the National Match version of this for - \$40.50
- Brand new 1917 Enfield cal. 30 rifle- \$20.00
- You could get a Model 1873 Trapdoor Springfield for - \$1.25 (yes 125 pennies)
- Since the Westinghouse Corp. made Mosin-Nagant rifles for Russia, you could buy a surplus 7.62X54 UNUSED for \$3.34!!
- For Ammo: Cal. 30 M-1 172gr. Boattail bullets in loaded cartridges \$49.56 for 1,200 cartridges ; cal.45 ball for M1911 pistol \$59.00 for 2,000 cartridges

And there is lots more, but I will type this for a "kicker" Large Rifle PRIMERS- \$2.36 per 1,000 !!!!!

Well, hope you have enjoyed reading this. If I figure out how to photocopy a full page of a newspaper (in the 1980's and before, The CRPA's The Firing Line wasn't a glossy magazine, it came as a newspaper), I will try and post this article at the Dillman Range

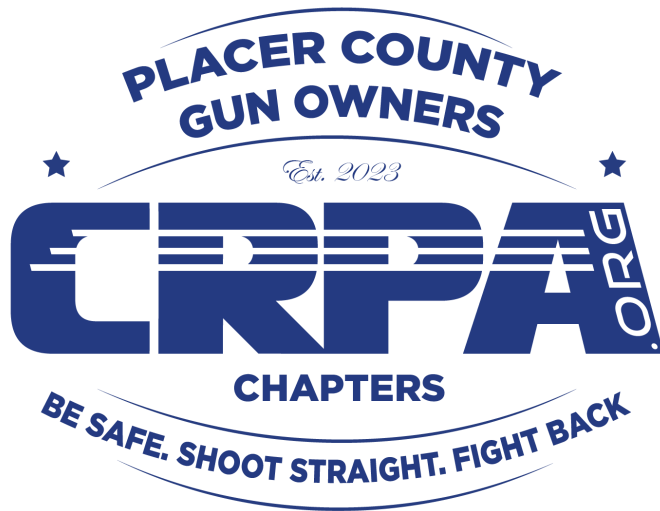
